"This State spends a lot of money," said Judge Hatch. The taxpayers pay a lot of taxes. But there is no place in this state where these people can be sent for treatment.

Remarking that "in these cases punishment is not what is needed" Judge Hatch referred to homosexnality as a "disease, and I use the word advisedly. What they need is treatment."


