


The Departments of Agriculture has reported that prices held steady to opening levels which were about the same as last year's opening bids.

The opening day sales Monday toaled 2,639,539 pounds at an average price of \$52.05 as compared with 2,922,076 pounds the same markets sold on opening day last

year at an average price of \$54 90. "Average prices by grades during the second day of sales held fairly steady at quotations of openchanges of only \$1 per hundred with a few more losses than gains," the Ag. Department says.




