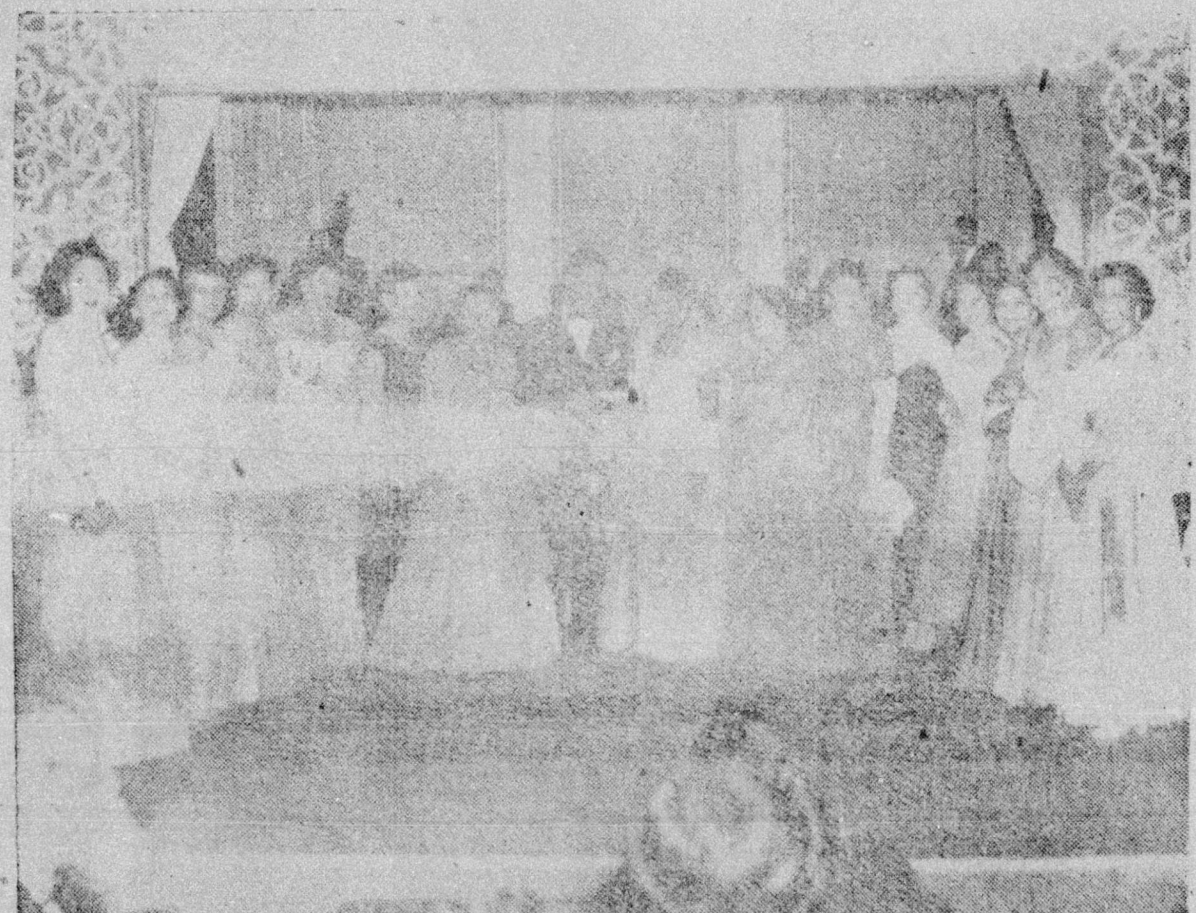
**Gates Leaders Set High Goals For Development**
