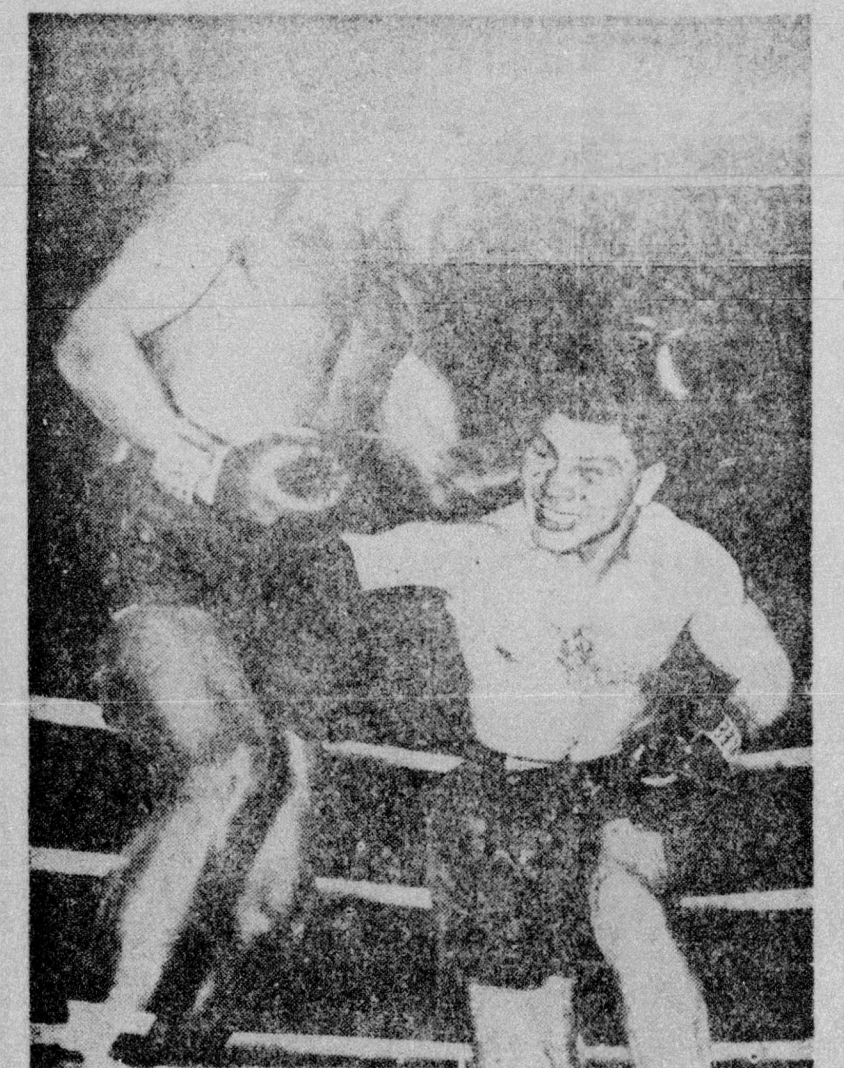

Fritz Pollard's SPORTS CLOSE-UP

NEW YORK (Global) — The "Pittsburgh Courier" of yesterday at least reared its head in our Colleges. It is reported that President Mordca Johnson of Howard University has ousted football coach Edward L. Jackson.

There is no definite word from either the heads of Howard University or Jackson as to the specific and true reason for his dismissal. Campus gossip has it, however, that he has been ousted because he borrowed a few bucks from the wealthy alumni to have some kids play on his football team.

It is stated that Jackson has spent a successful eight years at Howard and it appears to this writer that he has done a good job — even if he convinced some of the wealthy alumni "to put money to help boys through college" as reported. When it is not so, Howard has never had any athletic scholarships, it appears that it has fallen behind the Ivy League and the Big Ten Colleges, who have always had athletic scholarships for promising young athletes. Could it be that Howard University has been up aware of this?

After the larger colleges have bombed the field of Negro athletes, and selected the cream of the crop, there is little left for the coaches in the colored colleges anyway.

I do not believe in going out and paying athletes to attend college. No one paid my way through Brown University and I received no scholarship aid. While I was coach at Lincoln University for three years, as far as is known to me, no student was paid there because he was an athlete and no athlete received any particular help. Yet, during the three-year period I coached at Lincoln, we lost only one game and that was the one game in three years that the Lincoln

team was scored upon, and it was to Howard.

To my knowledge, if the coaches in my day knew anything about securing money to help a football player, it was unusual. Yet, I am sure some kind of subsidy took place. However, I am in sympathy with Jackson because high school students of today look forward to getting some kind of help if they are star athletes. Further, there are many boys who would never get a college education were it not for the fact that someone approached wealthy alumni and asked for financial aid.

What I cannot understand is why financial aid from anyone can be given to just a plain ordinary student, but if an athlete gets any kind of help, he is either penalized or ousted from college.

As reported, we do not know the real reason for Jackson's dismissal as coach, but if it is only for the reason that he allegedly did not money to help a student receive a college education, I think it is a poor excuse for relieving a man of his duties, when the man is of the integrity and caliber of Mr. Jackson.

I know many young men who have come out of Howard University to become very successful and a credit to their communities.

Howard coaches have always been character builders and I am sure that Jackson deserves his place in the sun with other outstanding coaches.

If an investigation is to be made, why doesn't the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association investigate all of its coaches?

Finally, I wonder if President Johnson, during his 27-year period, has been aware that this kind of help has been given students. There must be more behind the story than has been told.

Hampton Cagers Doing Fair In Current Season

HAMPTON, Va. — Hampton Institute exploded in the early stages of the final period to break open a close battle as the Pirates ran up a 79-55 basketball victory over Fayetteville, N. C. Teachers College at Hampton on Dec. 15.

Led by Donald Ellis, whose 22 points was the best scoring effort of the game, and Hammond Knox, who garnered 18, the Pirates streaked to a 20-point advantage within the first two minutes of the final period to completely wipe out any chances of an upset by the visitors.

Center Harold Adams tossed in 11 points to take third place scoring honors for the victorious Pirates.

Forward Theodore Bonner hit for 14 points to pace the losers and Edgar Anderson followed with 13.

On December 8 and 9, the Pirates played in the North Carolina College Tournament as part of the program opening their new gymnasium.

The night of Dec. 8, the Institute five let an early lead fade after the first quarter as the fast-finishing Tennessee State case-

bled to a 67-53 victory. Led by forward Allen Walker, center Harold Adams, Donald Ellis, and Lawrence Williams, the Pirates jumped off to a 10-13 lead in the first period but the visitors found the range in the second quarter to run up a 20-28 advantage at intermission.

A different story was told on Dec. 9 when the Institute cagers played Texas Southern University. Projecting a slim lead throughout a fast-breaking basketball contest they edged past Texas Southern 91-89. The Virginians fought off several belated deadlocking attempts by the Lone Star States in the final stages of the fourth quarter to preserve their slight lead.

Morgan State College on December 17, the Hampton Institute Pirates lost to the tune of 84 to 68. The host cagers took the lead in the first quarter and the Pirates didn't spark fast enough to even up the tally.

Garrett and Gardner led the Morgan attack, each scoring 23 points during the tilt. Pirate Allyn Walker led the Institute five by chalking up 19 points.

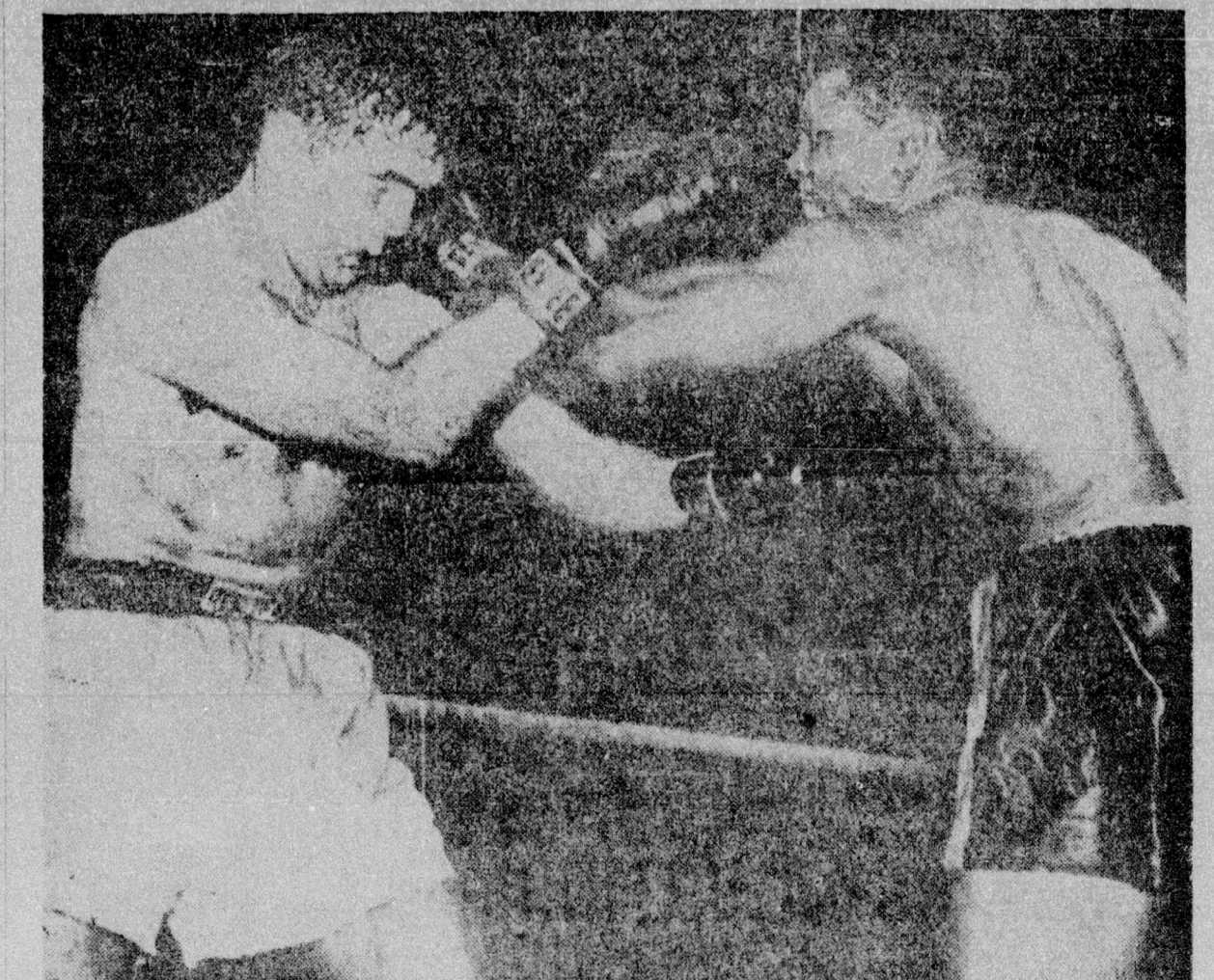
