The all - time high record was set last, when a total of 978 million pounds was produced in the State - breaking the previous record of 913 million pounds set in 1946. Acreage from which the current rop was harvested totaled 738,000 acres - the same as last year

This compares with the 10-year (1941-50) average of 645,300 barvested acres. The average yield this year was estimated at 1,225 pounds to the acre, compared with a yield of 1,325 pounds last year and 1,120 pound son the 10-year average. 


