

AFRICAN TOR - Mr. Mumuni Bawunja, a clerk of the Manprussi District Council, has been elected by the Electrical College of the Northern Territories as a territorial member of the Legislative Assembly. He replaces Abudu Mumuni, Dorimon-Na, whose seat in the Legislative Assembly became vacant when he ceased to be a member of the Northern Territories Council. Bawunia polled 19 votes as against 18 votes cast for imoru Salifu, a school teacher and 13 for Abudu Mumuni, Dorimon-Na. Born in 1921 at Nalerigu in the Mamprussi District, Bawunia was educated at the Gambara Native Authority School and the Tamale Middle Boys' School. Leaving school 10 years ago, he entered the Tamale Teacher Training college and become a feacher at the Naterigu Middle School three years later, in 1951 he was appointed State Secre-tary to the Mamprossi District.
