RALEIGH — The Ligon High School Little Blues remained undefeated as they added another victory to their impressive record of six wins against 40 defeats. The Blues defeated the Mary Potter High School eleven in a very impressive and colorful homecoming tilt at Chavis Park last Friday before an estimated 2,000 spectators.

The Ligon High team proved their superiority early in the game by taking the ball from their own 47 yard line and moving it in for a touchdown. John Baker, Chester Parker and Duke Peebles alternated in carrying the ball, with Parker finally making the score from the two yard line. Duke Peebles ran for the extra point, thus giving the Blues a 14-0 win early in the first period.

Mary Potter High School of Oxford, used some clever ball handling to score in the second quarter. Otha Williams, the quarterback, directed the offensive which finally set Mallory over to score from three yards out. Mary Potter failed in the extra point for a 14-6 halftime lead.

In the third period, Mary Potter was unable to gain against the Blues tight defense. The visitors had minus six yards for their efforts in this quarter.

For their final score, the Little Blues marched 75 yards. It came on a four-yard plunge by Baker.

In addition to the Bluefield game, other home games come against Fayetteville State. All on October 31st against Delaware State and on November 14th against Lawrenceville Ball Park.

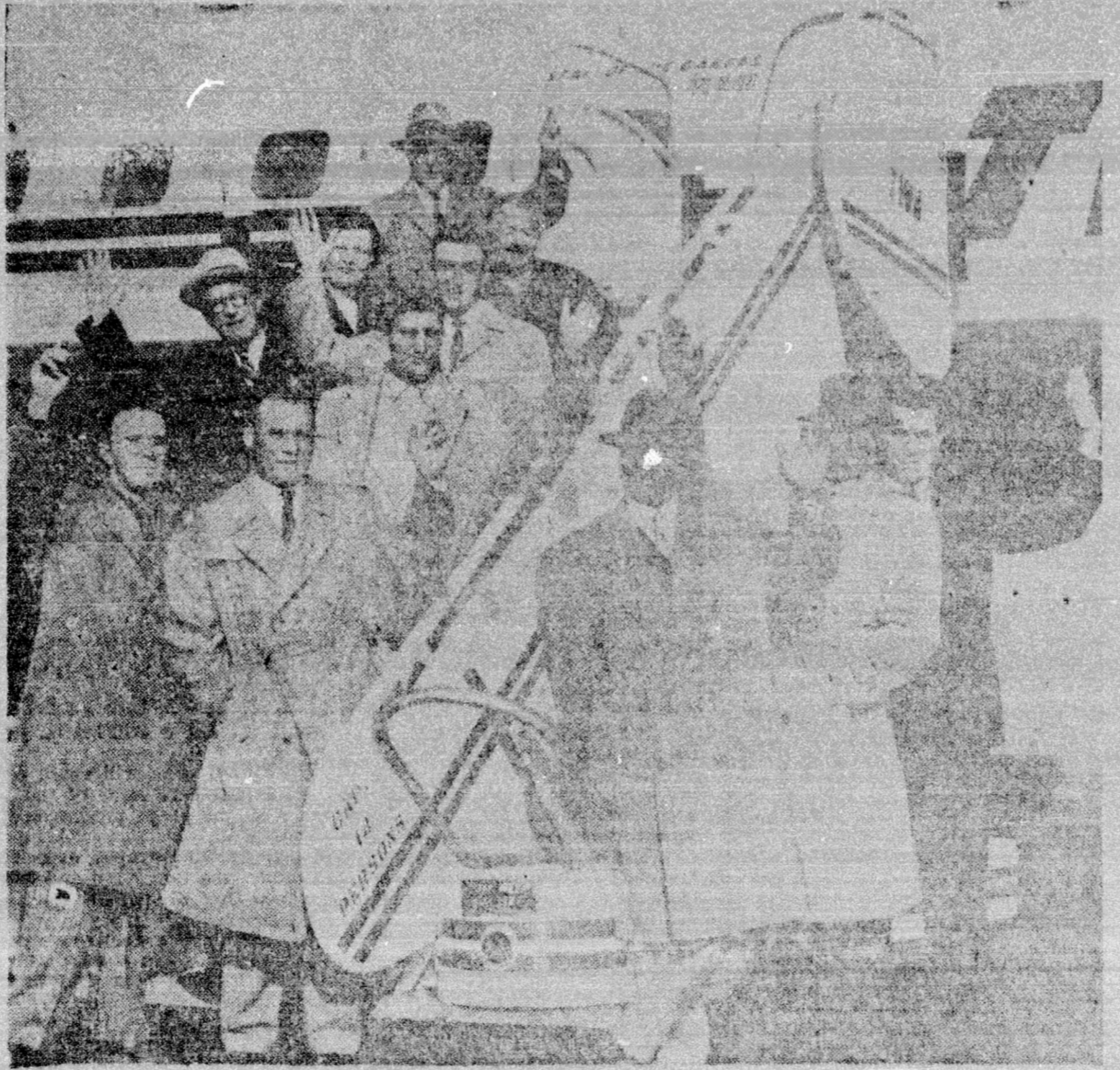
Homecoming activities will be launched Friday evening with a pep rally and bonfire on the campus.
