NEW YORK — Segregation is the most pressing product in South Africa, according to the Rev. Martin Jarrett-Kerr.

Writing in the current issue of the Episcopal Charch News, the priest asserted that the domin-ant National Party of Pulse Minister Malan is aiming at 'the maximum segregation that is practical."

"In the long run," the Episcopal Church News says, "the Nationalist Party is bound to fall." But in the meantime, some Violence is bound to occur.
