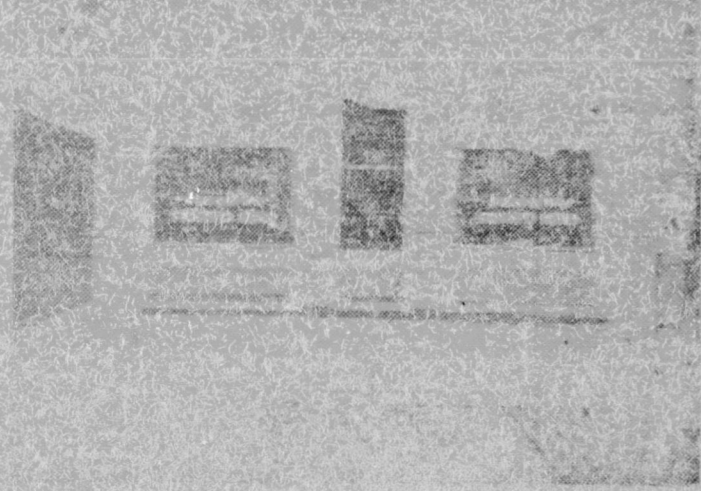

Mrs. Delia Howard Pope of 317 South Washington Street, Raleigh, was funeralized at the First Baptist Church here, Thursday, May 12. Interment followed in Mt. Hope Cemetery.

She had been ill for several months, but several months before she died at St. Agnes Hospital Monday evening.
