Summer Music School Closes At Ligon High

The second annual Instrumental Music Summer School will present its closing program Fri. night, July 13, at the Ligon High School Auditorium at 8:00 p.m. The public is invited. There will be no charge. As a result of the summer school, many of the students will be qualified for the advanced band and string groups and intermediate orchestra. Others will bypass the beginning class when school opens thereby putting them a semester near their goal.

The instructors felt that the 6 weeks program was successful. The students received experience in several areas of music, that is, quartets, full band, string orchestra, full orchestra and solo work. Some students began the study of a second instrument.

The curriculum included listening periods and elementary theory. Instructors were Joseph L. Edwards, band, and Mrs. J. E. Bouliware, strings.
