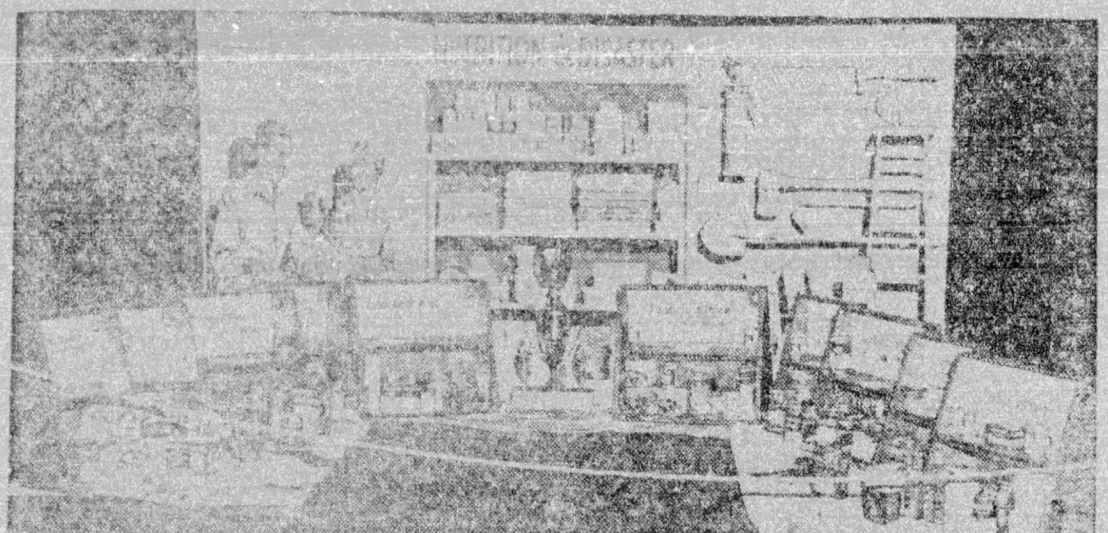

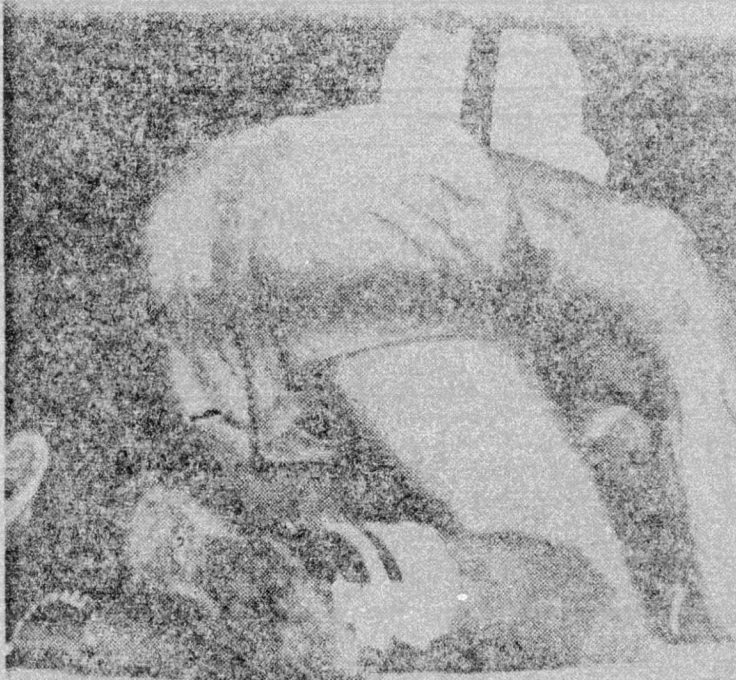
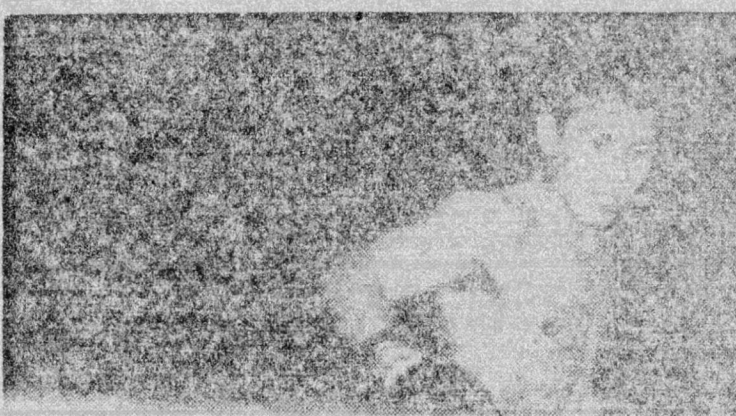

PLASTIC SILOS

A revolutionary method of producing high quality, low-cost silage has been revealed by a research team at the Purdue University Dairy Department in cooperation with Visking Co., Terre Haute, Ind., a Division of Union Carbide and Carbon Corp.

Silage in longshaped stack silos (above) is protected from water, air and sun by black tarpaulin covers of VISQUEEN polyethylene film made by Yelting. Pouch silos restrain farm animals from damaging the air tight covers.

The chemically inert film, available in 100' lengths and up to 22" width—depending on the thickness used, is inexpensive, flexible and easy-to-use. The plastic silos, 4 or 6mils thick, enable the farmer to harvest as much silage as he requires and locate his silo anywhere he desires.
