Dr. J. E. Thomas Guest Speaker At Monthly Career Conference

Dr. James E. Thomas, local physician, was guest speaker Tuesday night, April 2 at the monthly Career Clinic held at the Chavis Heights Community Center and sponsored by the AEA Sorority. Present were 75 members of the Junior and senior classes of Ligon School.

Dr. Thomas was introduced by the Clinic Chairman, Mrs. S. V. Perry, and spoke on the Subject, "Medicine As A Vocation." In developing his talk he used the method of first asking a question and then answering it. The four questions used were: I. Just what sort of person should want to become a doctor? II. How does one become a doctor? III. What are the opportunities for me once I become a doctor? IV. As a doctor what would be my reward?

In answering question No. 1 Dr. Thomas stated as the criterion of sincerity the following: "If you are willing to get out of a warm bed in the middle of a cold night, drive 20 miles, knowing that you will not be paid, to see a patient who you know can wait till morning, then I feel you are qualified to begin the study of Medicine."
