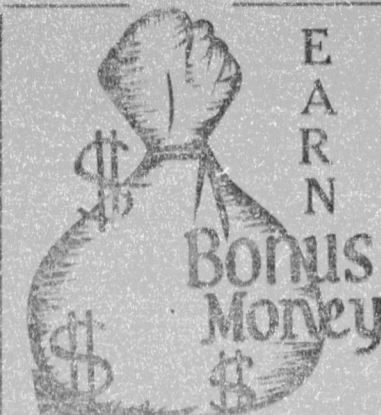


Parents Helpless As Five Children Die In Fire

Invitations for the annual state chamber of commerce dinner were "accidentally" sent to Dr. Cillian B. Powell, publisher of the New York Amsterdam News in Harlem, Mrs. William Stewart of Toledo, former president of the National Association of Colored Women, and St. Clair Drake, professor of Sociology at Roosevelt University in Chicago.

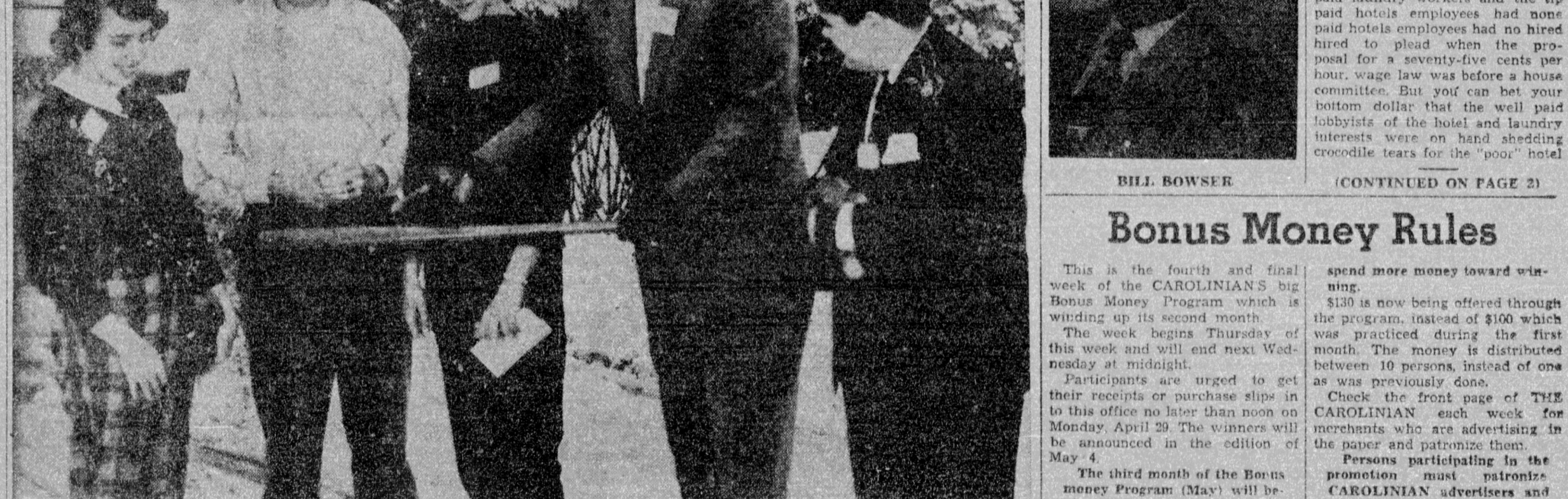
