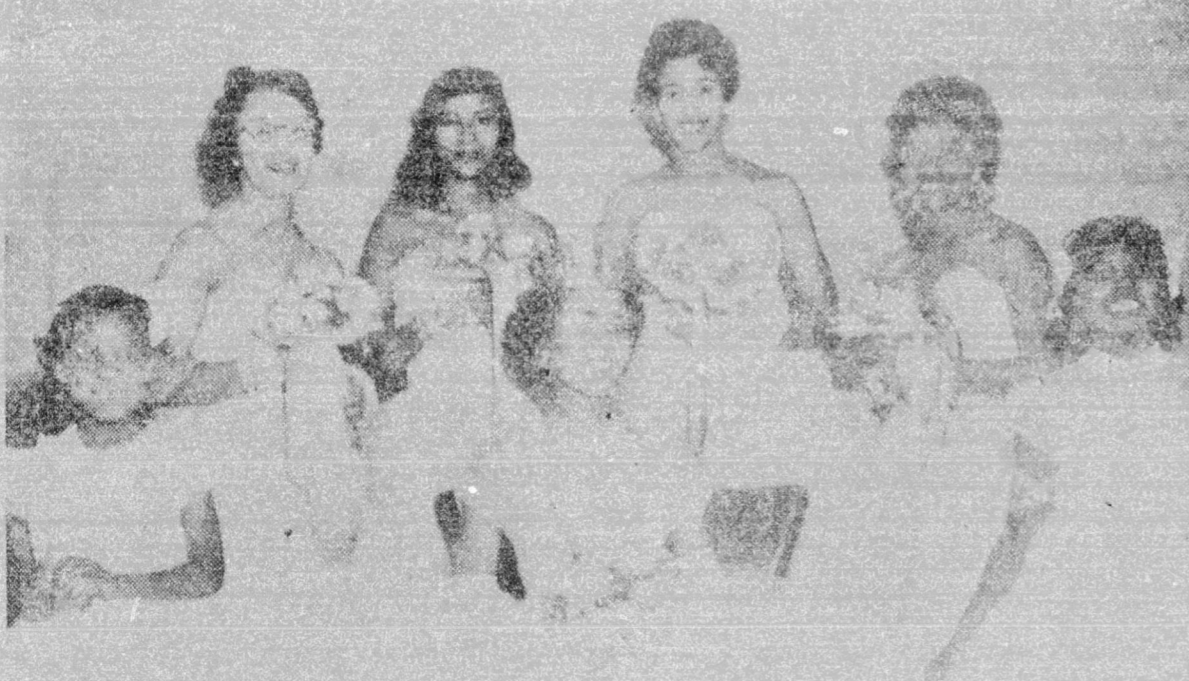




"PYGMALION" — When the Intercollegiate Drama Association held its annual Arts Festival at A&T College recently, these players from North Caro-

Dedication Of Shepard Statue Planned June 1 At 'Bull City'

DURHAM—James T. Taylor, executive secretary of the James E. Shepard Memorial Foundation, today announced plans to dedicate the life size statue of Dr. James E. Shepard, NCC founder and first president, on June 1 at 4:00 p.m. The bronze statue sponsored by the Prince Hall Lodge of the Free and Accepted Masons, in cooperation with the Shepard Foundation, has been created by William M. Zorach, noted Brooklyn, N. Y. sculptor. Dedication of the statue will be of three features of Alumni Day on Saturday. The annual Alumni Meeting will be held at 10:00 a.m. and the installation program at 8:00 p.m. Preliminary arrangements were made in Durham early this week at a joint meeting between the Shepard Foundation and State Masonic leaders. The late Dr. Shepard was for many years State Grand Master of the Masons. Representing the Masons at the meeting this week were Dr. G. D. Carnes, Grand Master, Wilmington; Clark S. Brown, Deputy Grand Master, Winston-Salem; Rev. C. W. Lawrence, Grand Secretary, Greensboro; Dr. H. N. Dowdy, Grand Treasurer, Washington; and W. A. Clement, Durham. Foundation representatives attending were Dr. J. M. Hubbard Sr., President, H. M. Michaux, Vice President, and Taylor, Executive Secretary. The statue will be located out in the circle in front of the college's Administration Building. Other events in the 40th annual commencement program include the baccalaureate service at 3:00 p.m. Sunday in the Men's Gymnasium with the Rev. E. Deedore Alston as speaker. He is rector of the Church of Our Merciful Saviour, Louisville, Ky. Dr. Howard Thurman, Dean Marsh Chapel, Boston University, will deliver the final address in the Gymnasium at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 4.
