Funeral services were held Monday, May 13 from Goldsboro Chapel with members of the North-West Conference and his pastorates in charge of the services.

Music was by a combined choir composed of members from St. Joseph, Jumping Run and St. Malilda churches. Solo by Mrs. Rosa Kornegay. Obituary by Mrs. Mattie Thompson. Eulogy by his friend and colleague, Rev. P. A. Hodges of Baltimore, Md.

Special services were observed by the American Legion, The Masonic Night of Gidden and Odd Fellow Lodges turned out in paying their last respects.

Active pallbearers were members of the Masonic Lodge and honorary pallbearers were fellow ministers. The Lightner Funeral Home of Goldsboro was in charge of the arrangements.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Palmitta Moye, one son, James H. Moye; one sister, Mrs. Almata Powell; one granddaughter, Paula Moye and several nieces and nephews.

Interment was in Hines cemetery in Lenior County.
