Senator Stuart Symington Lincoln U. (Mo.) Finalist

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo .--- Eighty ! nine degrees were conferred on graduates from Missouri and surrounding states at Lincoln University (Mo.) on Monday, June 3, in colorful exercises held at 7:30 p.m. on the quadrangle in front of the administration building.

Speaker for the commencement convocation was Senator Stuart Symington (D.-Mo.),

Senator Symington was appointed the nation's first sec-

lence. Each of the 11 were sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$10,000. While on bond awaiting an appeal. Winston, a Negro, and Green, white, fled to evade commitment.

Green did not surrender until February 1956 and Winston surrended the following month. Each was charged with "knowingly and deliberately" disobeying and resisting an order to surrender. For this violation they were sentenced to inree years in prison.

Winston and Green are asking the high court to decide whether a criminal contempt case may be punished by a prison sentence of more than one year


