

ATLANTA'S REV. BORDERS THRILLS 5,000 WITH PILGRIMAGE REPORT

Cheering Crowd Hears Bus Boycott Leader In L. A.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Before a cheering crowd of over 5,000 Sunday that filled the Shrine Auditorium, Rev. William E. Borders, fearless Atlanta leader, reported the historical events that took place when some 27,000 Negro citizens converged on Washington, May 17. Present on the platform with him, besides the 1,000-voice chorus led by A. C. Billbrew, were the Los Angeles "Pilgrims," who had returned from the Prayer for Freedom tour.

Crowd Gave Generously
With the Women Workers Union, inspiring other hundreds of individuals by donating \$1,000 for "The Cause of Freedom," a large sum was raised for the fight led by the local NAACP. Other donations included the Broadway Federal and Loan Association.

High Court To Review Cases Of Two Convicted "Commies"

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States Supreme Court has agreed to determine whether an excessive punishment has been imposed on two communist leaders convicted in 1949 for violating the Smith Act.

Henry Winston and Gilbert Green were two of the original 11 Communist leaders

found guilty by the New York District Court allegedly for attempting to overthrow the Government by force and violence.

Senator Stuart Symington Lincoln U. (Mo.) Finalist

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo.—Eighty-nine degrees were conferred on graduates from Missouri and surrounding states at Lincoln University (Mo.) on Monday, June 3, in colorful exercises held at 7:30 p.m. on the quadrangle in front of the administration building.

Speaker for the commencement convocation was Senator Stuart Symington (D-Mo.).

Senator Symington was appointed the nation's first secretary in the Air Force in 1947 and was elected U. S. Senator from Missouri on Nov. 4, 1952, for a term ending January 3, 1958. In the Eighty-third Congress he was appointed to the Armed Services and Government Operations committees, and to the Eighty-fourth Congress to the Public Works committee.

Baccalaureate Service for the graduates was held on Sunday, June 2, at 3 p.m., in Page auditorium on the campus at Lincoln.

Dr. M. Lafayette Harris, president of Philander Smith College, Little Rock, Ark., was the speaker.

Dr. Harris, who has been president of Philander Smith since 1936, is an ordained Methodist minister and the author of several books including "Life Can Be Meaningful." President and Mrs. Dawson entertained for graduates, alumni, faculty and friends at the President's home at 5 p.m. on Sunday after the baccalaureate program.

Alpha Kappa Mu is a national scholar's honor society which has among its requirements for membership a minimum scholastic as an advanced junior.

Each of the 11 were sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$10,000. While on bond awaiting an appeal, Winston, a Negro, and Green, white, fled to evade commitment.

Green did not surrender until February 1956 and Winston surrendered the following month. Each was charged with "knowingly and deliberately" disobeying and resisting an order to surrender. For this violation they were sentenced to three years in prison.

Winston and Green are asking the high court to decide whether a criminal contempt case may be punished by a prison sentence of more than one year.
