Two Die In Blazing Gun Duel

Sheriff, Farmer Both Die

TURRELL, Arkansas — A 46-year-old deputy sheriff here and a 28-year-old Negro farmer died last week in West Memphis hospital after a shotgun blast hit the face of one man and five bullets were pumped into the body of the other during a blazing gun duel.

Dead in the maze of gunfire are Crittenden County deputy sheriff Carleton Phillips and Edgar Grice, both of Turrell.

According to reports of Sheriff Ivan Dickson, he and Phillips answered a call to a store where Grice was allegedly threatening several persons with a shotgun. Upon their arrival, Dickson said, Grice jumped into his pickup truck where Phillips ordered him to throw out his shotgun.

Dickson said Grice replied to Phillips' command with a single blast from the shot gun that struck the deputy sheriff full force in the face. Dickson stated that he then jumped on the running board of the truck and unloaded his .38 caliber revolver into Grice's body.

Both Phillips and Grice died a few hours later in the hospital.

White Couple Owe Lives To 2 Negroes

CHARLESTON, Miss. (AP) — A white couple, Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Johnson are alive today after barely escaping death last week thanks to the efforts of two Negro brothers here who pulled them from their wrecked automobile. Knocked unconscious when their car punctured a tire and rained

over a bridge falling into five feet of water, little hope of their survival seemed likely as Johnson regained consciousness and began plopping the car, bent for help. Their heads were just barely above water when those unknown and his brother, driving by, spotted the troubled couple trapped in the wrecked car.

The two men immediately went to the rescue, pulling the pair from the wreckage without regard to their own health and safety.

Soldier Gets Six Years In Race Slaying

FORT RUCKER, Ala. (AP) — Following the testimony of four witnesses in the Army court martial of a Negro soldier here on trial for the alleged slaying of a white army sergeant during an interracial fight, the Negro G.I. was sentenced to six years hard labor last week.

Specialist third class Earl Stewart, 20, of Memphis drew the prison term after the board convicted him of killing M-574 Henry J. Brown, 23, of Cogswell, N. D., in a fight outside a non-commissioned officer's club here June 1.

She Died From Shock

Gas Chamber Urged For Rapist Of Ninety-Year Old L. A. Woman

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Shocked by what is listed as the worst sex crime in the present veritable epidemic, local citizens are insisting that nothing less than the lethal gas chamber be the punishment meted out to Alfred Sebastian, 28.

He had been recalled from the mental institution at Chino, Calif., where he was being processed for

commitment to a prison on a rape and robbery conviction.

But the victim, 90-year-old Mrs. Amos Steinmetz, never recovered from the shock and beating administered to her by the rapist, who had knocked her

in her purse, when he forced his way into her home late at night last April. When she died, the felony charges were changed to murder, and his trial set for Municipal court. The attack had been so brutal that even his drinking buddy, who witnessed it, was shocked, he told police.

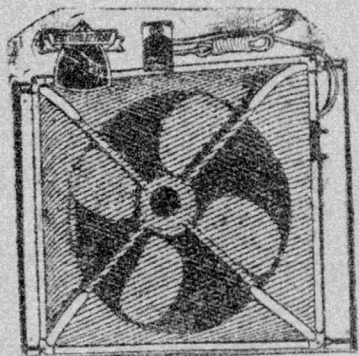
