Drama On Africa: Capacity Audience Witnesses "The Next Phase" In Dee Cee

WASHINGTON, C. C. — A capacity audience at the historic National Theater here recently witnessed the Washington premiere of "The Next Phase," a play which dramatizes the moral and political awakening of Africa.

This play was written at the Moral Re-Armament Assembly of Nations by six Members of Parliament from Ghana, the country that has most recently won its independence.

An audience drawn from Congress, the diplomatic corps, the State Department, the Pentagon, press, and social Washington received this prophetic new production with a standing ovation.

After the final curtain representatives of 14 African countries massed on the stage, many in their multicolored costumes. Africans stood beside Afrikans and Europeans from south, east and west Africa.

"Moral Re-Armament is the one force that can avert possible disaster and make our divided land into a pattern of unity," declared Chief Justice C. J. Classon of the High Court of Southwest Africa. He made "a heartfelt apology to Africans and other colored people present in the audience for my attitude of indifference and superiority which has contributed so much to the racial tensions in my country."

The Hon. Dewina Hammond, a member of Nkrumah's party and one of the authors of the play, said "We have won our political independence. We must have Moral Re-Armament to preserve it. It is the only adequate answer and the only ideology fundamental enough to meet hatred and fear, and to make a man govern his actions
