### Voters' League Planning Annual Confab For Sept.

RICHMOND, Va.—(AP)—The annual conference of the Virginia Voters League will be held at Smithfield, Va. Sept. 21-22 at the Isle of Wight County High School. More than 150 delegates representing 21 local chapters of the league are expected to attend the conference.

Founded by the late Dr. Luther P. Jackson, professor of history at Virginia State College, Petersburg, the Virginia Voters League is believed to be the only state-wide organization committed to getting Negroes to qualify to vote. It is a non-partisan organization, and is only interested in getting all adult Negroes in the state to become voters.

With less than 100,000 Negro voters in Virginia, the Virginia State College, Petersburg, the Virginia Voters League is believed to be the only state-wide organization committed to getting Negroes to qualify to vote. Voters League has a tremendous job to perform. Over five times as many white people in Virginia are qualified to vote than Negroes. In 1956 there were 422,670 Negroes in Va. 21 years old and older. That means that at least 322,670 Negroes were unable to vote in 1956.

There is as little or less obstacle to Negro voting in Virginia than any other southern state excepting that Virginia is one of the states requiring payment of the poll tax to vote.

One of the highlights of the annual conference of the Virginia Voters League will be a critical analysis of the conditions which account for the Negro's apathy, unconcern and inactivity in civic organizations and voting.

Dr. G. W. C. Brown, supervisor of the Evening College and adult services of the Norfolk Division of Virginia State College, is president of the Virginia Voters League. Amos C. Clark is executive secretary.
