Strasser, president of Shaw University, has announced that the ninety-second academic year at the University will begin on Tuesday, September 10, with a general staff meeting scheduled for 10:00 a.m. at Tyler Hall on Wednesday, September 11, at 8:00 a.m. Also at Tyler Hall, the opening faculty conference will be held in the form of a workshop. The theme of the workshop is "The Responsibilities of the Faculty and Staff in Achieving the Purposes and Objectives of Shaw University." This meeting will be followed by a luncheon in the Campus Inn. The orientation program will begin on Thursday, September 12, and will be directed by Dr. Marguerite M. Adams, University counselor. A psychological examination and a test in English will be given to all new students. University officials will lecture to the newcomers on the procedures and facilities of the institution. N. Y. NAACP Attorney Blasts "Phoney Liberals Of The Democratic Party"

NEW YORK (AP)—Blasting phoney liberals of the Democratic party and those Negro spokesmen who are more concerned with preventing a split in the Democratic party than with the elementary rights of our brothers in the South, outspoken Corrad J. Lynn counsel for the executive board of the Rockland County (N.Y.) NAACP, roused the battle cry of the current rebellion against leadership in political parties by Negro leaders.

In his letter, Lynn praises Rep. Joseph Martin of Massachusetts for "his uncompromising stand for a meaningful civil rights bill."

"Now we hear from the phoney liberals largely in the Democratic Party," Lynn continued, "that the bill was a harsh measure that the Senate did well to eliminate its

draconic provisions, that half a loaf is better than none. A feeling of shame afflicts those of us who are Negroes at the antics of some of our spokesmen who are more concerned with preventing a split in the Democratic party than with the elementary rights of our brothers in the South.

"Congressman Martin does well in ignoring the attacks on those of his persuasion as 'Black Republicans' or 'Radical Republicans.' Certainly the Republican Party

need not be assumed to be linked with those forthright spokesmen who struck the first hammer blows against the chains of slavery. Only as it again begins to live up to their convictions can it lay claim to being a modern party of the people."

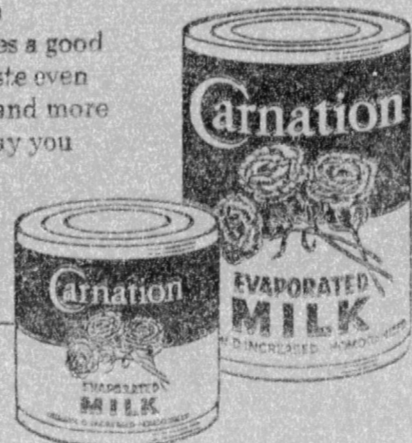

New York Migrant Labor Laws Are Not Enforced, Probe By NAACP, Reveals

NEW YORK (AP)—A barbed wire encampment patrolled by armed guards who did not permit the more than 100 Negroes confined within to leave the enclosure was among the abuses discovered in an investigation of migrant labor conditions in New York State. Herbert Hill, NAACP labor secretary, disclosed here Thursday.

Reporting on the investigation which he conducted jointly with the Rev. Letta R. Thomas, president of the Elmira, N. Y. NAACP branch, Hill said the work will be continued to discover possible violations of federal peonage laws. Hill reported that the study of labor camps and working conditions for migrant agricultural workers in four upstate

New York counties revealed "widespread violations of the recently-enacted state laws relating to migrant agricultural labor."

The camps investigated here in Chemung, Cayuga, Stoupen and Onondago counties. The barbed wire encampment was found in Martville, N. Y.

"Among the many abuses found were labor camps consisting of abandoned farm houses, dilapidated shacks and lean-to shanties without sanitary facilities, non-payment of wages by unscrupulous crew leaders, child labor violations and lack of crew leader registration and labor camp certification as required by state laws," Mr. Hill reported.

He said the migrant farm workers are Negroes brought mainly from Florida, Georgia and South Carolina.
