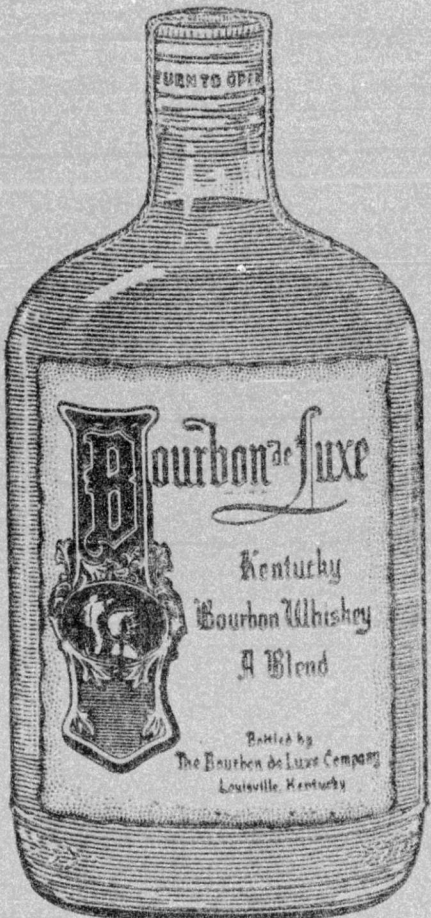


## Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Inc., Raleigh

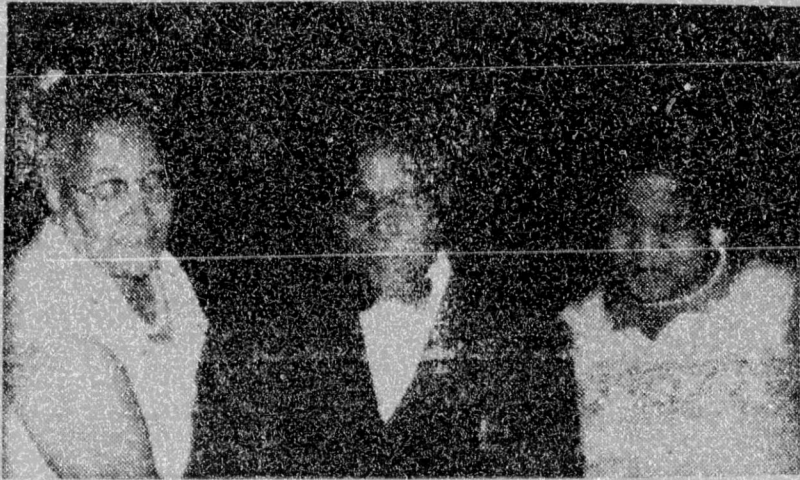

## Judge M. Paige New Alpha Prexy

LOS ANGELES — Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity in annual session here culminated its fifty-first year by electing Judge Myles A. Paige of New York its General President. Judge Paige, in his second bid for the office, defeated Walter H. Williams of Jackson, Mississippi, and Byron Rumford of Berkeley, Calif. Frank L. Stanley, retiring General President of Louisville, Kentucky, did not seek reelection.

Reaffirming its support of the NAACP, Alpha Phi Alpha awarded five life memberships to its living founders: Henry A. Callis, George B. Kelley, and Nathaniel A. Murray, and to James E. Huger and Frank L. Stanley. Roy Wilkins, principal speaker of the convention's public meeting, presented the life certificates. Mr. Wilkins was the recipient of the Alpha Medal of Honor for distinguished service in the field of

human relations.

Other featured convention speakers were Dr. Felton G. Clark, president of Southern University; Bishop Frank Madison Reid of the A. M. E. Church; Attorney A. T. Walden of Atlanta, Georgia, who was awarded the Alpha Award of Honor for his many years of leadership; Oliver W. Higgins and Founder George B. Kelley.

Social activities included many beach parties, golf tournament, trips to Disneyland and Hollywood. The top affair was the Coronation Ball at the spacious and beautiful Hollywood Palladium. The closed banquet and dance attracted over 1,200 Alphas and their guests. The next general convention was set for December, 1958, at either Richmond or Philadelphia.

## I. H. Miller Retires At Salisbury

SALISBURY — According to an announcement by the Board of Trustees of Livingstone College, Prof. Isaac H. Miller retired from the institution on Sept. 1 after serving in the department of education for 28 years.

A native of Mississippi, Prof. Miller received his education at Rust College and the University of Chicago. Prior to his tenure at Livingstone College, he served at Okolona Industrial School in Mississippi; Clark College in Atlanta, Ga.; Cookman Institute in Florida; Bennett College in Greensboro; and Rust College in Mississippi. He has held the positions of president, dean, professor and principal in these various institutions.

The education department of Livingstone College has flourished under Prof. Miller's direction, and today there is hope in a county in North Carolina as well as other areas outside the state where the influence of his teachings cannot be felt.

As a civic worker, Prof. Miller's contributions have been numerous. He is a charter member of the Civic League and The Rowan Teachers Credit Union. He has also supervised various community drives such as the Community Chest, Red Cross and the United War Fund. Because of his high esteem in the community, in February of this year the new Negro Recreation Center on West Bank Street was named "Miller Recreation Center" in his honor.

He is very active in religious activities and serves on the trustee board as financial secretary of Moore's Chapel A. M. E. Zion Church.

Prof. Miller is married and has three children who are presently engaged in educational services. His daughter, Mrs. K. Eloise Simpson, is chairman of the music department of Livingstone College. His older son, Howard, is a teacher in the high school at Marion, and his other son, Isaac, Jr., who holds a Ph. D. degree from the University of Wisconsin in biochemistry, is a professor at Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tenn. All are graduates of Livingstone College. Prof. Miller and wife reside at 1006 West Monroe Street in the city.
