**FOREIGNERS DOUBT OUR DEMOCRACY**  
**ROCKY MOUNT** — A few years ago the writer, along with others from Tarheelia, called upon the late Senator Clyde Hoey in his Dece office regarding civil rights denial, particularly voting rights for colored people in eastern Carolina — the Elizabeth City area.

We asked Mr. Hoey if he realized that all such abuses of democracy — denying Negroes the use of the ballot and various discriminations — was material upon which Communism would thrive. We reminded him that we had heard Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt tell the NAACP at the Lincoln Memorial in June 1947 (the same time President Harry S. Truman spoke to us) that "it is becoming increasingly hard for us (US) to bargain around the conference table with other nations so long as segregation and discrimination continue."

Hoey's reply was, "Whenever anyone goes overseas and comes back with an idea he wants to put across, he has to say, 'Until the evening day we never forgot that comment.'"
