## NAACP Into Registration Work In Va.

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — John M. Brooks of this city assumed the position of assistant to the executive secretary of the Virginia State NAACP on Sept. 1. It was announced here this week by W. Lester Banks, the executive secretary.

Banks said that Brooks will be in charge of the Virginia NAACP political action program. "Under his direction," Banks stated, "the NAACP's registration and voting program will be accelerated throughout Virginia."

Employment of Brooks by the Virginia unit is in line with the Association's campaign to increase registration and voting among Negroes throughout the South.

Mr. Brooks has served for the past year as executive secretary of the Richmond Crusade for Voters, a non-partisan political organization.

## Board Wants Attorney General To Halt "Open Defiance" By Faubus

NEW YORK (AP) — The NAACP has asked President Eisenhower to take over command of the National Guard in Arkansas and to instruct the U.S. Attorney General forthwith to proceed with the necessary legal action to halt the open defiance of constituted authority by the Governor of Arkansas.

The request was set forth in a telegram dispatched to the President over the signature of Dr. Channing H. Tobias, chairman of the Association's national Board of Directors. The meeting on Sept. 9 was the first of the Board since last June in Detroit.

The full text of the wire to the President follows:

"In view of the continuing constitutional crisis in Arkansas with

the outbreak of violence precipitated by Governor Faubus' rash action in ordering state troops to prevent implementation of a federal court order, the board of directors of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People urges you to take immediate steps to federalize the Arkansas National Guard bringing it under

your direct command as commander-in-chief of the armed forces of the United States. Further, the board urges you to instruct the United States Attorney General forthwith to proceed with the necessary legal action to halt the open defiance of constituted authority by the governor of Arkansas.
