NEW YORK — A survey of the integration story in Arkansas and Tennessee will be the principal highlight of CBS Radio's "So They Say" Friday, Sept. 20 at 9:30-10:00 p.m. EDT (WCBS Radio, New York at 10:30-11:00 p.m. EDT). The CBS Public Affairs broadcast will include: An interview with the Rev. F. L. Shuttlesworth, the Alabama minister who was beaten when he tried to enter his daughter in Birmingham's Phillips High School; Excerpts from Arkansas Gov. Orval Faubus' news conference; Statements by Nashville, Tenn., officials including the Chief of Police, school officials and parents of the children enrolled in Nashville's ill-fated Hattie Cotton grammar school.

## Integration Timetable Must Not Be Stopped, Clayton Powell Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressman Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. called the following message to his Washington office last week: "The integration timetable must not be disrupted by lawless elements. What is happening in Arkansas has upset the already complex timetable for desegregation which has been gaining respectable acceptance across the nation. "Employing armed troops to keep Negro children — or any children — out of school is a shameful disgrace. The use of armed interven-

tion to maintain segregation despite the local school board's desire to integrate and in defiance of a federal court order that it do so, amounts to rebellion. The National Guard is uniformed, armed, and partially sustained by the federal government and must be made to give full cooperation to the decisions of the courts. It is the duty of the federal government to prevent obstruction of its laws.

### RIGHTS FORCES STRENGTHEN PRO-CIVIL

"Earl Maze was absolutely correct when he wrote in the NEW YORK HERALD TRIBUNE on Sept. 6: 'Stronger civil rights legislation was seen today as one of the sur-

est by products of the Arkansas integration incident.' The very emotions which the southern senators tried to lull to sleep have been awakened. Governor Faubus' action is vastly strengthening the position of the pro-civil rights forces everywhere. The 'Faubus Technique' will win converts to Part III when the debate on civil rights reopens in the next session of Congress. "Governor Faubus' political-ly manufactured 'emergency' has needlessly brought a crisis into be-

ing. He has taken upon his shoulders action in defiance of federal law. This action, if successful, will imperil the whole fabric of democracy. Gains already achieved will be lost if it were determined that federal authority and the federal courts could safely be flouted. MUST NOT BACK DOWN. "President Eisenhower must not back down. He has vowed to defend the Constitution by every legal means at my command. The President should order no federal funds now to any state in defiance of federal law.

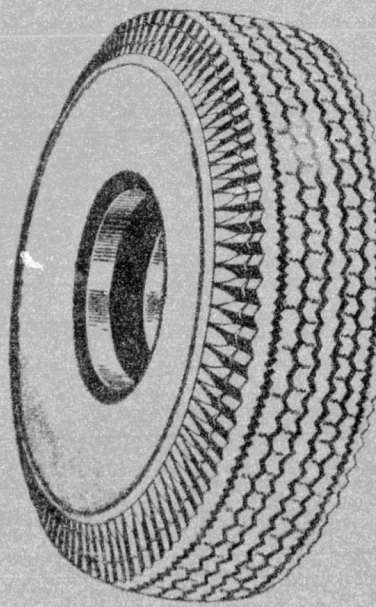

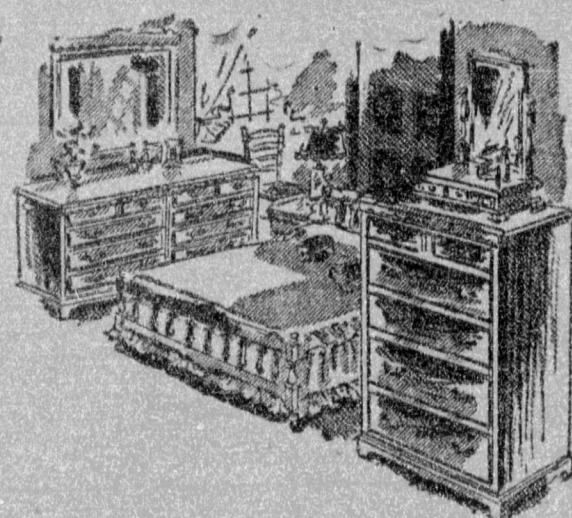

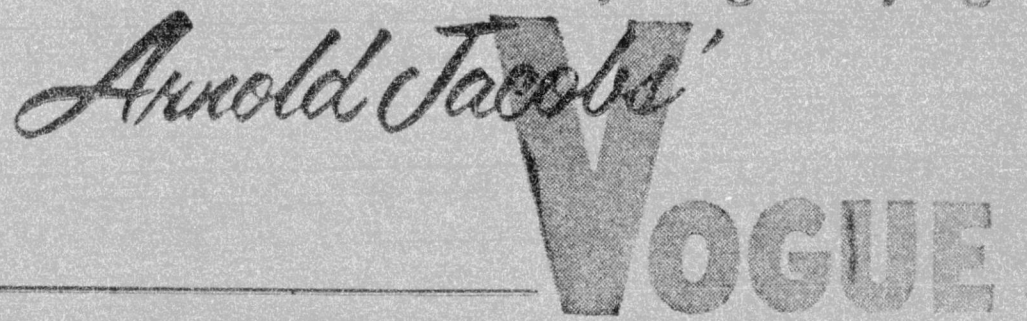
