



Dixie Boycotts 'Satchmo,' Other Tan Entertainers

major Southern capital city, reports are rampant that a Dixie poycott is being directed against Louis "Satchmo" Armstrong and other Negro artists as reprisal for their riticizing of the handling of the Little Rock school integration dispute.

Armstrong, meanwhile, is being especially pegged for his withdrawal from a State Department sponsored tour of Russia and for plasting the treatment of Negroes in the South.

In Hattiesburg, Miss., a disc jockey announced that he was refusing to play records by Armstrong, Eartha Kitt, and Lena Horne because they endorsed "Satehmo's" criticism.

His announced campaign is simllar to others being conducted in a subtle manner against Negro stars in other Southern cities. Por instance. Juke joints in Birmingham were plugging up the slots of all records by Negroes. while in Atlanta, selections by




