

# 'Hire On Basis Of Merit,' Jackie Tells Executives

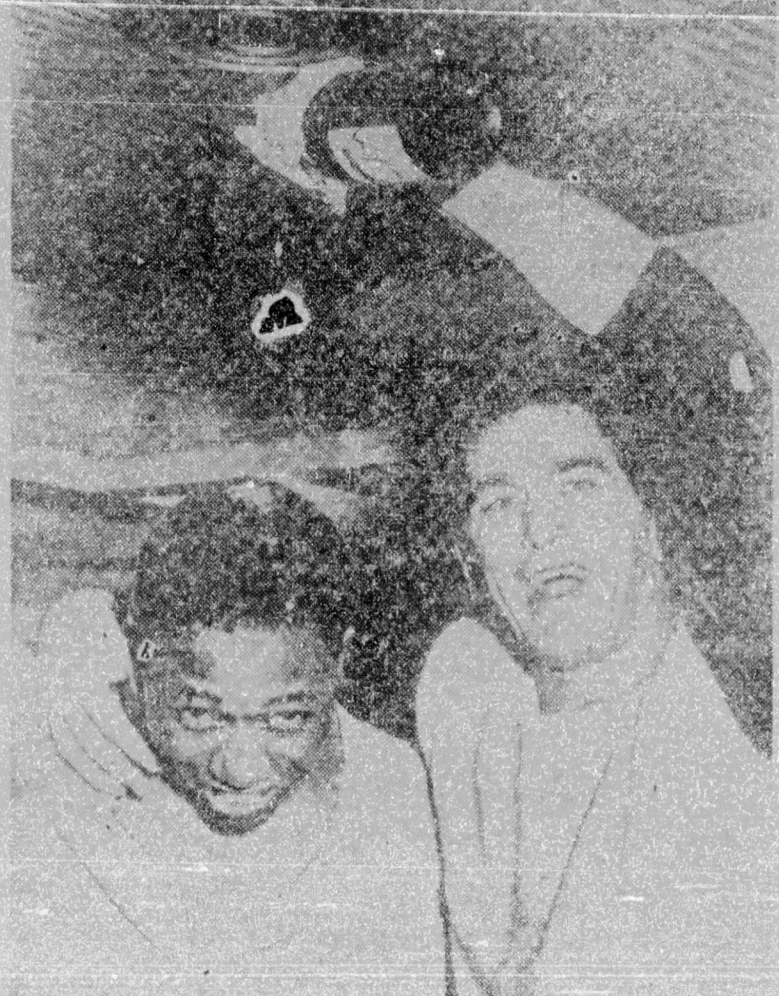
NEW YORK (AP)—Ex-Dodge star Jackie Robinson challenged 1,500 personnel and industrial relations executives today to hire and promote minority workers on the basis of merit, and said that industry's failure to employ and train them was "showing a mean hand at the individual and the nation as a whole."

Robinson, who joined the restaurant chain and coffee company six months ago, spoke before the opening session of the American Management Association's fall personnel conference at the Hotel Statler.
