

# "Build Not For One Brief Day," Speaker Advises Bennett Group

GREENSBORO — If one does not live when he has little, he is not likely to when he has much. As John M. Pearson, of New York City, said Sunday at Bennett College during memorial services for Mrs. Annie Merner Pfeiffer, Mrs. Pearson, who is chairman of the Department of Work in Foreign Fields of the Women's Division of Christian Service of the Methodist Church, spoke on "Build Not For One Brief Day." It was her first visit in 20 years to Bennett College, where five structures bear the Pfeiffer name.

In eulogizing Mrs. Pfeiffer and her husband, Henry Pfeiffer, the speaker related that, despite their great wealth, they lived frugally and humbly.

She told of their benefactions both here and in foreign lands — to churches, hospitals, schools, YMCA's and children's homes in such far-away places as Brazil, India and Korea. "Mr. and Mrs. Pfeiffer," she said, "believed that their great wealth was a trust from God and their gifts were made without thought of race, color or creed." Speaking directly to the students, Mrs. Pearson said: "Most of us will not have millions of dollars, but each of us has something to give — brains, talent, love, faith and goodness. You can begin your truly adult life right here at this college, keeping in mind that it is not what you get, but what you give that counts most."

## Undertaker Gets Life In Slaying

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — A local Negro undertaker, Mascelous Thornton, 48, was convicted of murder and sentenced to life imprisonment in Superior Court here last week.

Thornton was sentenced after a Fulton Superior Court jury, which deliberated three and one-half hours, found him guilty of the Aug. 20 pistol-slaying of Charles Ward, a Negro filling station employee.

Following the sentencing, defense Atty. Dan Duke filed a motion for a new trial.

Permanent pastures and alfalfa are long-lived crops and therefore do not have to be sown each year. Tobacco roots should be plowed up now.

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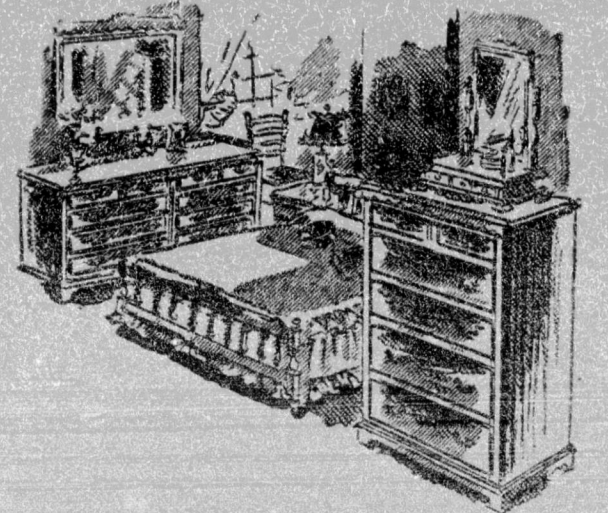
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
