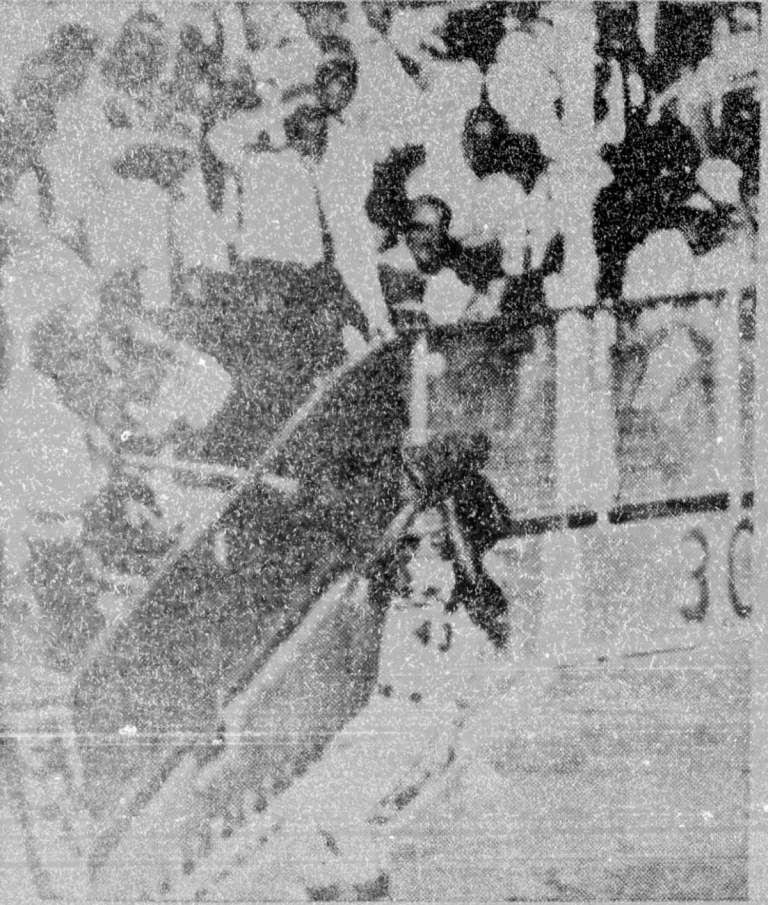
## Homecoming At FSTC Nov. 16
