# "Buck Passing" Charged In Token Housing Desegregation At Depot

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Reports received by regional NAACP officials indicate that authorities at the Naval Ordnance Depot, Bay Pitt, Nevada, have begun a desegregation which leaves most Negroes piecemeal victims of housing desegregation.

In housing at Babbitt, the "piecemeal" desegregation as explained by Field Secretary Lester Bailey amounts to the scattering of several Negro families throughout the housing area. "But the fact remains that there is deliberate housing segregation in Babbitt," Bailey stated.

Civilian and naval authorities in Babbitt are not administering the local housing policy in keeping with the letter and spirit of Executive Order.

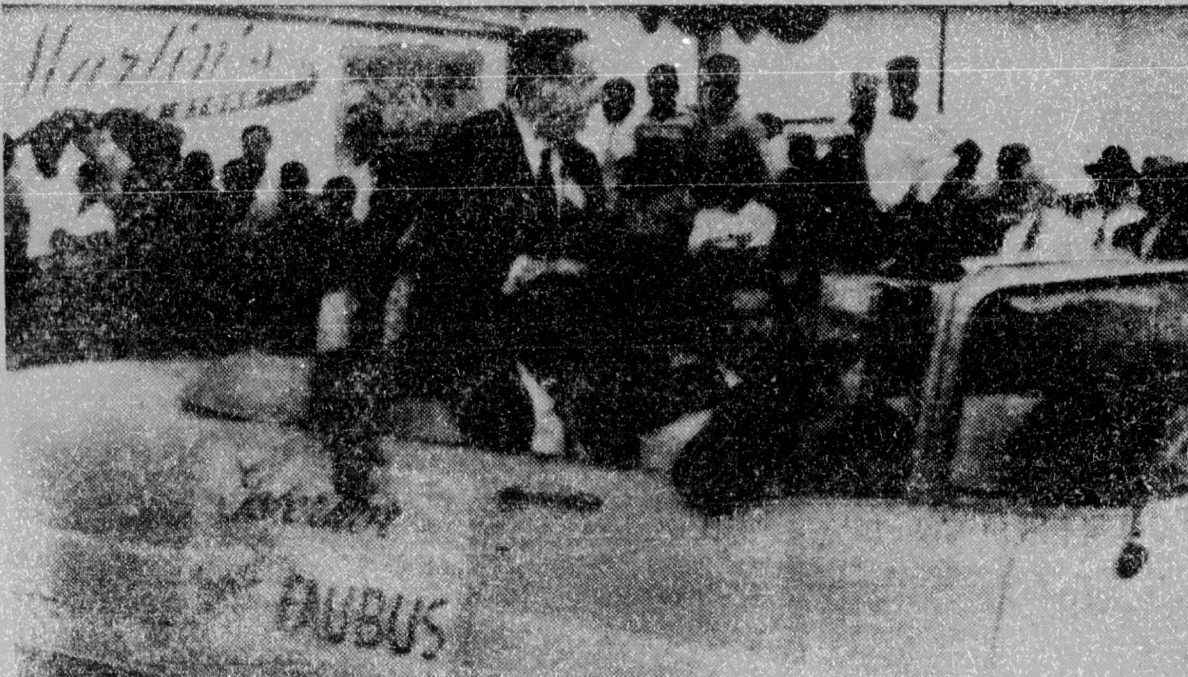
# ST. AUGUSTINE'S Campus Chatter

Rev. James Kelly:  
W. Va. State Dean Addresses Group At A & T

GREENSBORO — "Don't let this world squeeze you into its own mold," an A and T College audience was urged last week.

The speaker was Rev. James Kelly, personnel dean and professor of philosophy at West Virginia State College, Institute, West Va., who delivered the sermon at Harrison Auditorium on Sunday morning, October 6.

The young minister, a graduate of Gordon's College of Theology, Boston University and the School of Religion at Koward University, spoke from the subject, "Hearing A Different Drum." He used the text, "Be not conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds."

He said the group that whom man faces the dilemma of the necessity of conformity and the challenge of non-conformity, he still can listen to another drum and if a man fails to keep pace with his companions he must hear a different drum.

"You must have the eyes to see and the ears to hear that there is a different drum, otherwise," he continued, "you may follow the easy path of least resistance."
