New Apex Library To Observe Open House October 24

APEX — The formal opening of the Apex Library, a branch of the Richard B. Harrison Public Library, will be held Thursday, October 24, 1957 at 8 p.m.

The library, which is located on Highway 1, has been made possible through a grant of \$2,400.00 from Federal Funds under the Library Services Act. The funds, which must be used in rural areas with populations of less than 10,000, are being used for new furniture, shelving, salary, rent and general maintenance.

The "Friends of the Library," an organization of Apex has given a cement walk, shrubs, drapes, and other items to beautify the building. The book collection consists of 2,500 books supplied from the Harrison Library collection.

The library will be open weekly on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 4 to 8 p.m., and on Saturday from 1 to 5 p.m. Mrs. Irene Stuart is librarian.

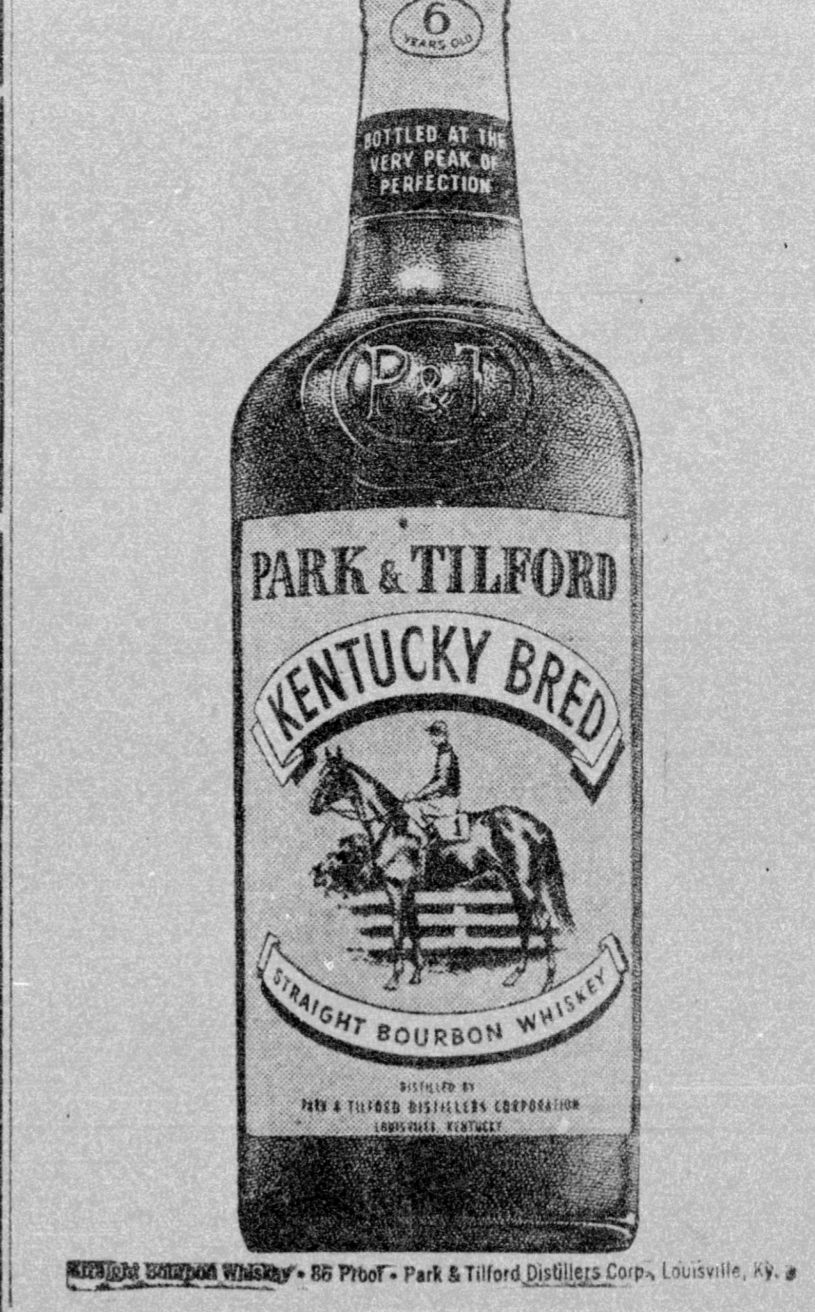
