Reid, one of the nation's leading social scientists, will deliver the College holds its annual Foun- the leading colleges in the U.S.

Dr. Reid, professor of so-ciology at Haverford College, Haverford, Pa., since 1947, has had a distinguished career in education, in social welfare work, and in research. Following his graduation from Morehouse College, he earned the M.A. degree from the University of Pittsburgh and the Ph.D. from Columbia Univer-

He has taught in the public schools in Texas and West Virginia, and, on the college level, has taught at Atlanta and New York universities. For a number of years, he served as director of research for the National Urban League, and at one time was a social economist with the Social Security Board.

In addition to serving various other government agencies, Dr. Reid has found time to write a number of books and at one time was editor of Phylon magazine.

Bennett College was founded as a co-educational insti-tution in 1873. It became a college for women in 1926, at which time, the late Dr. David D. Jones, became its president, serving until 1955, when he was specceded by Dr. Wil-

la B. Player. Since 1926. Bennett has graduated over 1.700 young women, the majority of who make teachers and homemakers. Many, however, have been attracted to the professions and hold graduate degrees from leading universities and pri-
