JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Two Negro journalists of Ebony Magazine, had to spend the night in jail here early last week because there were no accommodations for them. Hostels there are for whites only.

Forced to spend a night in jail on a stopover were Miss Eva Bell Thompson, Chicago, managing editor of Ebony, and Ebony photographer G. Marshall Wilson, assigned to the publication's New York office. Both are visiting Tanganyika, Ghana, Nigeria and Malawi for a series of articles for Ebony.

While it was reported that

the two were apparently treated courteously by local authorities and were simply "put up" in jail for the night, the incident provoked strong reaction in America. Negro Americans have long been critical of South Africa's racial policies.

In Chicago, Ebony publisher John H. Johnson said he was writing the U. S. consulate in Johannesburg for more information on the incident. He indicated that a protest was in the making.

For Bennett College Dr. Ira Reid To Deliver Address At Founder's Day

GREENSBORO — Dr. Ira D. Reid, one of the nation's leading social scientists, will deliver the principal address when Bennett College holds its annual Founder's Day services in Pfeiffer Chapel, Sunday, November 3, at 4 p.m.

Dr. Reid, professor of sociology at Haverford College, Haverford, Pa., since 1947, has had a distinguished career in education, in social welfare work, and in research. Following his graduation from Morehouse College, he earned the M.A. degree from the University of Pittsburgh and the Ph.D. from Columbia University.

He has taught in the public schools in Texas and West Virginia, and, on the college level, has taught at Atlanta and New York universities. For a number of years, he served as director of research for the National Urban League, and at one time was a social economist with the Social Security Board.

In addition to serving various other government agencies, Dr. Reid has found time to write a number of books and at one time was editor of Phylon magazine.

Bennett College was founded as a co-educational institution in 1873. It became a college for women in 1926, at which time, the late Dr. David D. Jones, became its president, serving until 1955, when he was succeeded by Dr. William B. Payer.

Since 1926 Bennett has graduated over 1,700 young women, the majority of who make teachers and homemakers. Many, however, have been attracted to the professions and hold graduate degrees from leading universities and professional schools.

If that is not enough, there will be on hand Little Joe, who has just made the nation's Top 40



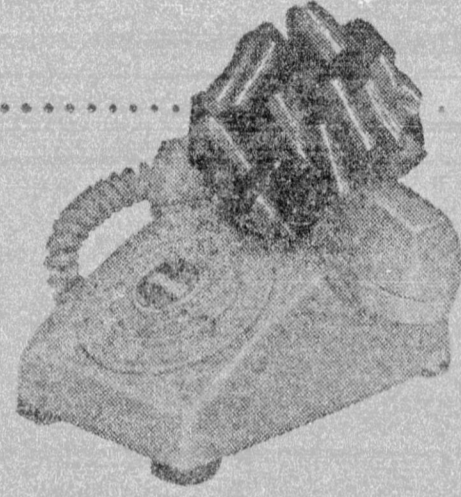

Dr. Mays To Be NCC's Founder's Speaker Nov. 4

DURHAM — Dr. Benjamin Mays, president of Morehouse College, Atlanta, Ga., and one of the nation's outstanding Baptist clergymen, will deliver the 10th Founder's Day address at North Carolina College on Monday, November 4, at 11 a.m.

Students and alumni will join in memorializing the late Dr. James E. Shepard, who founded NCC in 1910 and served as president until his death in 1940.

Traditional graveside rites at Beechwood Cemetery after the speech and the annual meeting of the Shepard Memorial Foundation at 4 p.m. in Room 104 of the Administration Building are other features of the day.

Founder's guests and visiting dignitaries will be entertained at the annual president's luncheon given by Dr. and Mrs. Alfonso Elder.

Dr. Mays is an honor graduate of Bates College. He received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Chicago.

He has been granted some eight honorary degrees from some of the leading colleges in the U.S.

Prior to becoming president of Morehouse College on July 1, 1940, Dr. Mays served as dean of the School of Religion at Howard University.

Dr. Mays has published five books and encyclopedias, written articles for numerous periodicals, and served on some 24 organizations with national and world connections.

During 1944-46, Dr. Mays served as vice president of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America.
