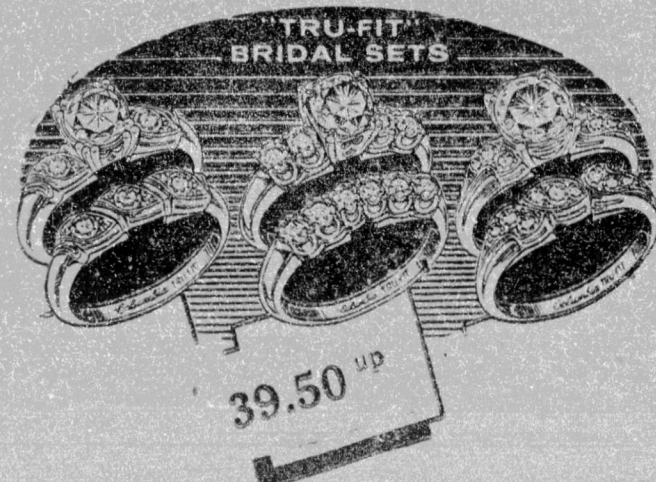

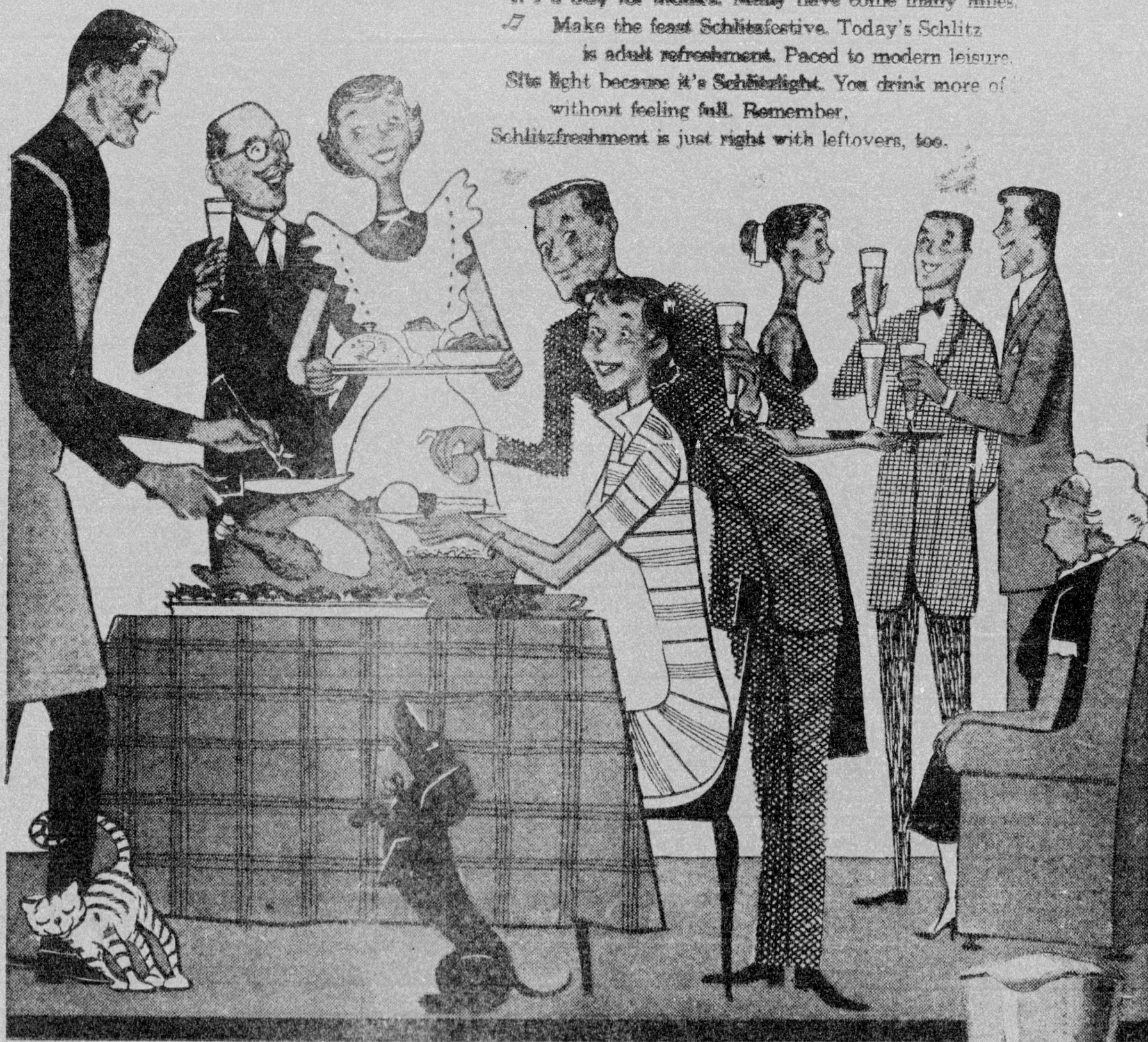

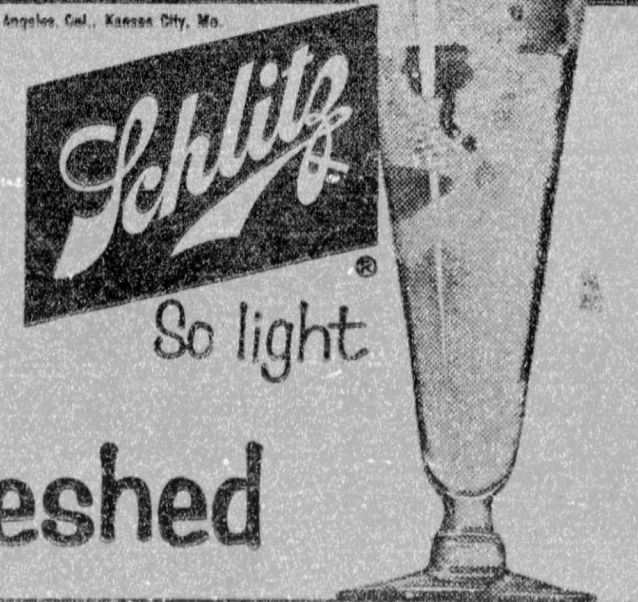

Mr. Alston succumbed Saturday, November 9, at Saint Agnes Hospital after a short illness.

Burial followed in the church cemetery.

He was senior Deacon of Williams Grove Baptist Church, where he had been a member since childhood. He held the following offices: Superintendent of Sunday School, Treasurer of the church, the father of the Willing Working Sunshine Band No. 2. He was the chaplain of Mentor Lodge No. 55, Free and Accepted Masons of N. C., of which he had been a member for 40 years, and a member of the Raleigh Safety Club.

He was for many years a faithful and trusted employee of the Raleigh Public Service Company. Formerly the Raleigh Gas Company.

He is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Rosabelle Alston Hinton, of Raleigh, Mrs. Wilhelmina Alston Montgomery of Washington, D. C., and Mrs. Doris Alston Turner of Philadelphia, Pa.; two sons, Mr. Phillip C. Alston, Jr., of Philadelphia, Pa., and twelve grandchildren.
