

Missing Youth Returns To Home In Mississippi

Say Boy, 16, Slipped Off To See Aunt

WASHINGTON (AP) — Unofficial reports have reached Washington that a young boy, Harvey Bradford, 16, who disappeared from his hometown, Natchez, Miss., some time Oct. 21, has been found.

Word had circulated that the 16-year-old youth had been seized by white men and had not been heard from since. He was officially reported missing on Nov. 4, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation was already working with local and state officials trying to track him down.

Two days after it was reported that Bradford had been found, he was reported to be coming and taking a train to Natchez. The detective who made the report stated that the youngster returned home unharmed.

It was said he had been to visit an aunt. The U.S. Department of Justice would not verify this report as they had received no official confirmation at press time.

UNCF Distributes \$450,000 To 31 Member Institutions

NEW YORK — The United Negro College Fund is distributing \$450,000 to its 31 member colleges and universities today, according to W. J. Trent, Jr., Fund executive director.

Today's allocation is the second distribution of money raised in the College Fund's 1957 appeal. It brings the total amount received this year by the participating colleges to \$1,395,388. Final grants will be made after the official closing of the 1957 campaign, Dec. 31.

"Since it was established in 1944, the College Fund has annually raised approximately 110 per cent of the combined operating budgets of its member institutions," Mr. Trent said. "The unrestricted nature of Fund grants has increased their usefulness tremendously. They may be used to meet any current need, from erecting a Ph. D. to repairing a boiler."


During the current year, UNCF allocations will be used principally to provide scholarship and work aid for exceptional students who could not otherwise continue their education; to increase faculty salaries thus retaining valuable faculty members and to purchase laboratory and classroom equipment.

Lee H. Bristol, president of Bristol-Myers Company, is national chairman of the current campaign. Stanley C. Hope, president, Esso Standard Oil Company; William T. Gesselt, vice president, Ford Motor Company; and James E. Stamps, regional director, Social Security Administration, are vice chairmen.

The 1957 campaign is being conducted in 118 cities and towns throughout the country, including the communities where the 31 colleges are located.
