Students Pack Howard Chapel To See, Hear Dr. M. L. King, Jr.

WASHINGTON, D. C. (AP)—An overflow congregation which flooded the sanctuary of Rankin Chapel at Howard University this week heard Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. say the nonviolence can be used to "turn civilization upside down."

Students filled the basement hall of the chapel, stood in corridors and sat on the stairs of speaker had been set up to hear the young minister from Montgomery, Ala., advocate civil disobedience where segregation is involved.

"We must stand up as an organized mass," Dr. King said, "and refuse to cooperate, yet somehow do this with love in our hearts for those opposed to us." Warning against violence, he said that it would create more problems than it could solve. If violence is resorted to, Rev. King said, "unborn generations will be the recipient of a long night of futility and wickedness."

But the Negro, he said should

not resign himself to discrimination. "The minute we passively accept injustice we cooperate with it."

Preaching without notes in a sermon occasionally punctuated by an "Amen" from older person in the audience, Dr. King said that Negroes should obey Jesus and love their enemies because hate does nothing but intensify the existence of hate and evil in the universe.

"Through the power of love," he said, "we can redeem our enemies and transform them."

Kasper Gets Six Months As Jim Crow Speech Try Fails

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—Racist John Kasper was sentenced this week to six additional months in jail for contempt of an injunction prohibiting interference with school integration at Clinton Tenn. Kasper and six other segregationist defendants were refused a new trial by Federal Judge Robert L. Taylor.

The self-styled upholder of segregation now must serve a total of 18 months in jail; he started serving last month a

sentence of one year handed down by Judge Taylor as a result of a contempt conviction.

Although Judge Taylor allowed Kasper to start a speech before the court, prior to sentencing, the segregationist was cut short when he began speaking out about the "responsibilities of citizens in guarding against communism in government."

The bounty of our gracious Lord.

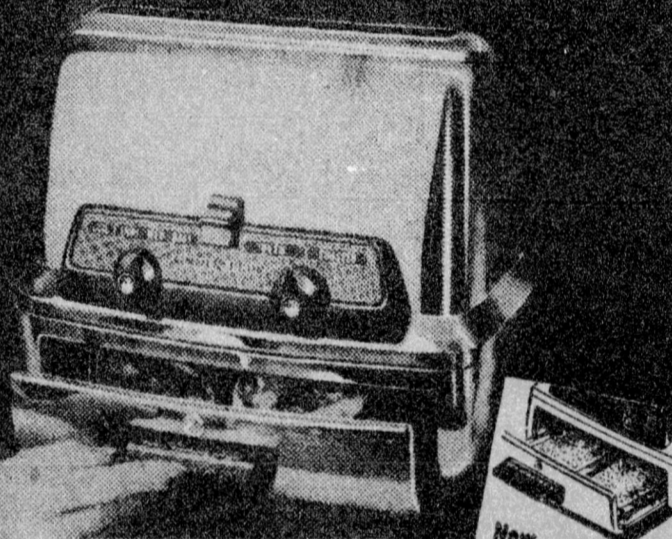
