Calls Lena Horne's "Jamaica" Year's Most Successful Show

NEW YORK (AP) — First copies of an RCA Victor original cast recording of the new Broadway musical JAMAICA reached dealers this week, just 72 hours after the music was put on tape. JAMAICA, starring Lena Horne and Ricardo Montalban, opened at the Imperial Theatre in New York, Oct. 31st. The book is by the authors of "Finian's Rainbow" — E. Y. Harburg and Fred Saisly, with music by Harold Arlen and lyrics by Harburg. The musical is presented by David Lewis. Brooks Atkinson of the New York Times has called JAMAICA "The season's most successful musical comedy put on to entertain the public. It is beautiful, modest and good-humored. In the last couple of years the musical stage has had to make do with a lot of hackneyed music, written by the yard by tunesmiths who copy other tunesmiths, thus compounding mediocrity. Mr. Arlen is a musician. He has style, imagination and a sense of humor. He knows what to do with a musical idea, which is to make it sound like his own work and not like shoplifting." "Miss Horne sings everything with skill, precision and gaiety." The show was recorded in two days Sunday and Monday — November 3rd and 4th — under the direction of Ed Walker, Victor's Manager, Popular Albums, Artist and Repertoire.

JAMAICA is the story of Savannah (Lena Horne) a resident of Pigeon Island, a mythical place in the West Indies. As a village beauty, she longs to leave Pigeon-in-the-Caribbean with its mango trees and coral reefs for the more challenging climes of Bagdad-on-the-Hudson. Though she is in love with a fisherman, Koli (Ricardo Montalban), she nearly loses herself to a big spender, Joe Nashua (Joe Adams), intent on taking her to the island of her dreams. Also living on Pigeon Island are comedienne Josephine Premice — last seen in "House of Flowers", Adelaide Hall, Ossie Davis — Eric Rhodes — and a sensational youngster — Augustine Rio.

3 Faculty Members From St. Augustine's College Attend College Confab

Three faculty members of St. Augustine's College attended the November 13, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Twenty-second Annual Meeting of the North Carolina Negro College Conference which was held at Fayetteville and Student Participation in

Institutional Policies. During the morning session, an address was made by Dr. William C. Archie, dean of Wake Forest College at Winston-Salem, N. C. He outlined the extent to which it was feasible for faculty to participate in setting administrative policies. Dr. J. Caple Sibley, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, University of North Carolina, spoke in the afternoon on "Faculty Participation in Institutional Academic Policies." He said that academic policy consists of those governing the admission of students, curricula and degree requirements. Continuing he remarked that while policy determination in these areas is a faculty responsibility, the faculty must leave to the administration the responsibility of administering the policies. At the luncheon in H. L. Cook Dining Hall, Dr. Marguerite Adams, University Counselor at Shaw University, addressed the delegates on the topic "Student Participation in Institutional Policies." Faculty members from St. Augustine's College attending were: Dr. Presell Robinson, dean; Richard B. Matthews, Mathematics department and Marcus H. Baulware, English department.

Panel Discussion Held At Shaw U.

The Division of Social Sciences Shaw University held a panel discussion in Greenleaf Auditorium Friday, November 22, involving "The Crisis in Human Relations in the South Today." Because of the economic, political and cultural advancement of the Negro in recent years, he is more concerned with the pressing crises confronting him today in the south. The religious, educational and social leaders in the Negro community have led the fight for economic and political equality. The Reverend John White, a senior of Wadesboro, served as moderator for the panel and pointed out that, since Negroes were freed from slavery, there has been one continuous struggle by them to gain a first-class status. Students who presented topics for discussion were: Esper Wilkins, a sophomore of Norfolk, Virginia, whose topic was Religious and Cultural Aspects of Negro Life; Emily Winstead, a senior of Roxboro, "Economic Aspects of Negro Life." Observations made from the discussions were that the Churches are the most segregated places in the world; Organizations of labor played an important part in getting Negroes established in skilled labor; and The NAACP is the only organization that has battled for the rights of the Negro. It was concluded that immediate integration is necessary in order for the Negro to have the opportunity of making himself ready to meet the challenges of the future.
