## \$70 GRAND FOR NAACP

ROCKY MOUNT—In New York last week, some 1300 guests paid nearly \$70,000 in payments on NAACP Life Memberships at a \$100-a-couple dinner for those who would pay in full or part on \$500 membership in NAACP.

Heading the list of outstanding citizens from all walks of life were Gov. Averell Harriman of New York, Duke Ellington, famous bandleader; Branch Rickey, Sr., who started Jackie Robinson, former Brooklyn Dodgers baseball star—first Negro to play in the "big league"—and numerous other notable. These leaders called for increased support of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People with the result that 400 new Life Memberships were added.

Robinson, who is NAACP Freedom Fund campaign chairman, said: "No one is really safe as long as anyone is in danger of discriminatory treatment," such as was accorded Nat "King" Cole and Willie Mays. (Cole was almost mobbed while making a concert appearance in his native Alabama and Mays was at first denied the right to purchase a house in a "white" residential section of San Francisco recently.)

NAACP recently was presented to Ellington and Rickey for loyalty to NAACP and the advancement of race relations. Ellington responded by saying, "Tell all the people you know that they should become members of the NAACP." Rickey declared: "It is not fair to expect one-tenth of the population to carry the burden of a great national problem which properly belongs to the other 15 million Americans." Rickey added: "If ever there was a time to come to the aid of the NAACP, it is now."

Gov. Harriman, in noting the "vicious attack" being made on the NAACP in many states said: "It is just as important that the civil rights of a Negro be protected in this country as the civil rights of an individual." "More than ever," the Governor said, "the NAACP deserves the encouragement and support of all citizens who believe in the fundamental principles of our Constitution and the Bill of Rights."
