William Lockett Mason, who, in-cidently, announced that this season marked his twentieth anniversary as pastor of the local church nearly 300,000 Baptists in Tarheelia

fors Mason told Rev. Strassner that due to the sharp increase in unemployment among colored citizens locally (he reported 3000 out of work during September) the church and its auxiliaries were only able to present \$562.75 to Shaw at this time. Mason assured the college head that there would be more given before the March deadline when the college, its alumni and friends are challenged to raise at least \$1,000 over and above its regular budget in order to receive a special grant of \$10,000 from a triendly source Donations may be sent direct to Shaw University, Raleigh, N. C. The local Shaw Atumni Club is aiding in this project guided by J. W. Wiley.

AMOS SMITH, LIBERIAN TALKS Accompanying Dr. and Mrs Strassner here was Amos J. Smith. a native Liberian student, studying at Shaw University under a special scholarship from the Govern ment of Liberia and Shaw jointly Mr. Smith talked to the Susan Sanders Missionary Circle Sunday afternoon on a program directe Mrs. Mamie Ryals, sovera youths who attended the Lott Ca. cy Missionary Convention in Orange, N. J., last summer also re-

Smith said he was from the territory Marshall, apprepiately named after General George C. Marshall, father of the Marshall Plan of aid to needy natnons. His home is about 50 miles from the ecapital city-Monrovia, Liberia and he has been in America only three months, but has been quite observant of American customs. Some of these are that American women do not appreciate their hair as do the women of his country, Smith finds the American female cuts her hair whereas, only those Liberian women who have come to America go home and cut their hair; and then they are the ob-

During a question and answer period it was revealed that, altho-Liberia has a minister of war in its cabinet (which is on the American plan) there is no sizeable military establishment in the 110-yearold Negro republic whose founders were emmigrants and descendants from former slaves from Ameri-

Smith explained that due to the deep religious convictions of the Liberians, the nation has not armed itself in a formidable manner and they have not been faced with any great military threat during its 110 years of existence. They have an abiding faith in God and

Smith told the high school stud ents they would have in study algebra, chemistry, physics and biology until they reached the junior year in college when they could hegin specializing.

Smith warned all organizations (particularly females) being sent to Africa as missionaries because, he said, if they are too young they will be overcome with the prosperity of Liberia and forsake their Missionary work and become, as he put it, "money-aries". He cited examples of such.
