Judge Dismisses Damage Suit Brought By White
Wife Barred From Dancing With Negro Husband

WASHINGTON (AP)—Municipal Court Judge Leonard P. Walsh, Monday, dismissed a \$25,000 damage suit of a white woman who claimed to have been barred from dancing with her Negro husband at the Moulin Rouge, a few months ago. Mrs. Leopoldine M. Tynes filed the suit against Pandora Gogos, proprietress of the club, on the grounds that she suffered "humiliation" and other "emotional distress" when she was ordered to stop dancing with her husband. A \$3000 suit which Mrs. Tynes' husband, Richard filed against Miss Gogos is still pending in Municipal court, is a \$3000 counter suit brought

by the proprietress against the Tynses for slander. The \$23,000 was originally filed in the District Court, which has jurisdiction in civil suits where the amount involves more than \$3000. But it was later certified to Municipal Court by a District Court judge. The judge has that right if he believes that the verdict will be \$3000 or less.

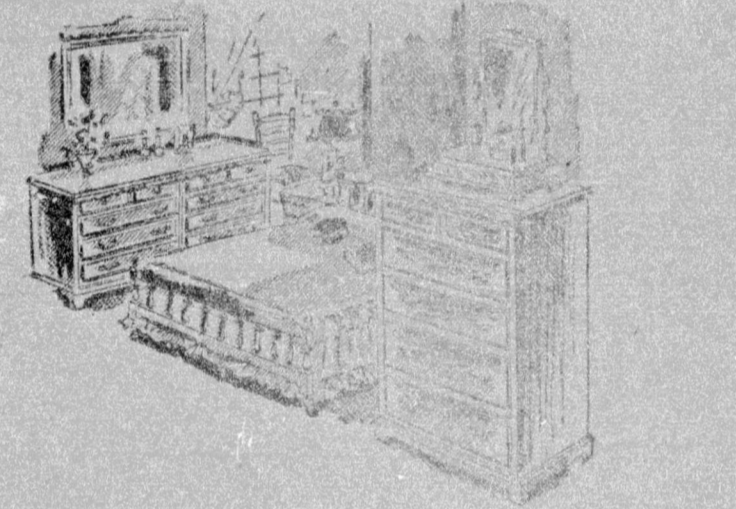
