"The Negro Moves Up:"

Secretary Mitchell Lauds Achievements Of Negroes

NEW YORK, N. Y. — Pointing out that a third of U. S. Negroes own their homes, and that the population as a whole has a yearly purchasing power of 175 billion dollars, Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell lauds achievements of the race in a December Reader's Digest article, "The Negro Moves Up."

Secretary Mitchell says the quiet revolution which has changed Negro economic status since World War II is "the most amazing social and economic story of this decade."

The number of Negro proprietors and manager has increased 131 percent in the past 16 years, he reports. They own more than 200 insurance companies with five million policyholders, including members of all races. They also own and operate 44 banks and savings and loan institutions, with combined assets of more than 100 million dollars.

He tells the story of Asa T. Spaulding, vice-president of the North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Co. of Durham, N. C., and a U. S. representative at last year's UNESCO conference in New Delhi, India; of S. B. Fuller, who 21 years ago started a business with \$25 and now heads a firm employing 5000 salesmen, one fifth of them white; John Johnson, on relief 20 years ago and now publisher of Ebony.

And, he says, there are hundreds of success stories less spectacular, but just as encouraging. There is Bernice Smith, copy chief of Gregory and House and Jansen, Inc., an advertising agency in Cleveland, Ohio; William C. Curtis, a senior electrical engineer with RCA in Morristown, N. J.; Edward W. Brooke, former National Judge Advocate of AMVETS; Robert C. Weaver, State Rent Administrator of New York; Rosa M. Young, retired chief supervising nurse of Tubercular Hospital Los Angeles County General Hospital; Alma S. Jacobs, head librarian, Great Falls, Mont.; Arthur Burgess McCaw, former acting budget director, State of Nebraska; Dr. Grace Marilyn James, instructor in pediatrics of the University of Louisville Medical School in Kentucky.
