WASHINGTON (AP) — Lionel Hampton and his famous orchestra will leave America this month for a "Good Will" tour of many foreign countries. His travels will cover all European countries, and also Greece. While this will not be an ordinary commercial tour, Hampton is going with the backing of the State Department and the Voice of America.

Realizing that America has suffered a "black-eye" because of the Little Rock situation, Hampton has expressed his desire to inform the people on

The trip will keep Hampton and his band abroad for the remainder of the winter. He expects to wind up his travels in Africa in the spring.

CP & L Common Pays 33-Cent Dividend

Carolina Power and Light Company directors voted here today to raise the quarterly dividend on common stock by three cents.

Quarterly dividends of \$1.25 per share on \$5 preferred stock were declared, payable January 2, 1958, to shareholders of record December 18, 1957.

A quarterly dividend of 33 cents per share on common stock was declared, payable February 1, 1958, to shareholders of record January 10, 1958. The 1958 construction budget will

be submitted to the board in January, according to Louis V. Sutton, president and board chairman. He estimated raw improvements next year would cost \$22,000,000. A big part of it will go toward completion of the 235,000-horsepower steam generating unit now under construction at the Cape Fear plant near Moncure.
