

A-Bomb Pioneer To Give Lecture Series At A & T

A-BOMB PIONEER TO GREENSBORO—One of the leading scientists who worked with the production of energy from uranium, first at the University of Chicago, where initial experiments were conducted on the original A-Bomb, will lecture here in Greensboro early next month.

Dr. Lyle B. Borst, now chairman of the Physics Department at New York University, will deliver lectures here on Tuesday and Wednesday, February 4 and 5 under the auspices of the Visiting Scientists Program of the American Institute of Physics.

His visit is being sponsored by the Department of Physics.

His Tuesday program calls for an address by a general assembly of A. and T. students, 10:00 A.M., a conference period with college students at 2:00 P.M., and a technical lecture for combined student science groups at 7:00 P.M. On Wednesday he will address the students of Dudley High School, 10:00 A.M.; conduct a conference with the Physics Department Staff members at 2:00 and deliver a technical lecture to science faculties of neighboring colleges at 8:00 P.M. All appearances except the Dudley High engagement are scheduled for A. and T.

"Parliamentary Law" and "Methods of Speech Correction" will be offered in the evening program at St. Augustine's College beginning the second semester.

Registration will take place on Wednesday, January 29, in Room 202, Hunter Building, from 8:30 to 9:30 p. m.

List your real estate, all personal property including automobiles and dogs. All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years of age required to list poll tax.

The law requires that taxes be listed in the month of January. A penalty of 10% will be added for failure to list. List now and avoid this penalty.

"I am returning herewith the letters which you enclosed from Warner Brothers, Paramount, and 20th Century-Fox.

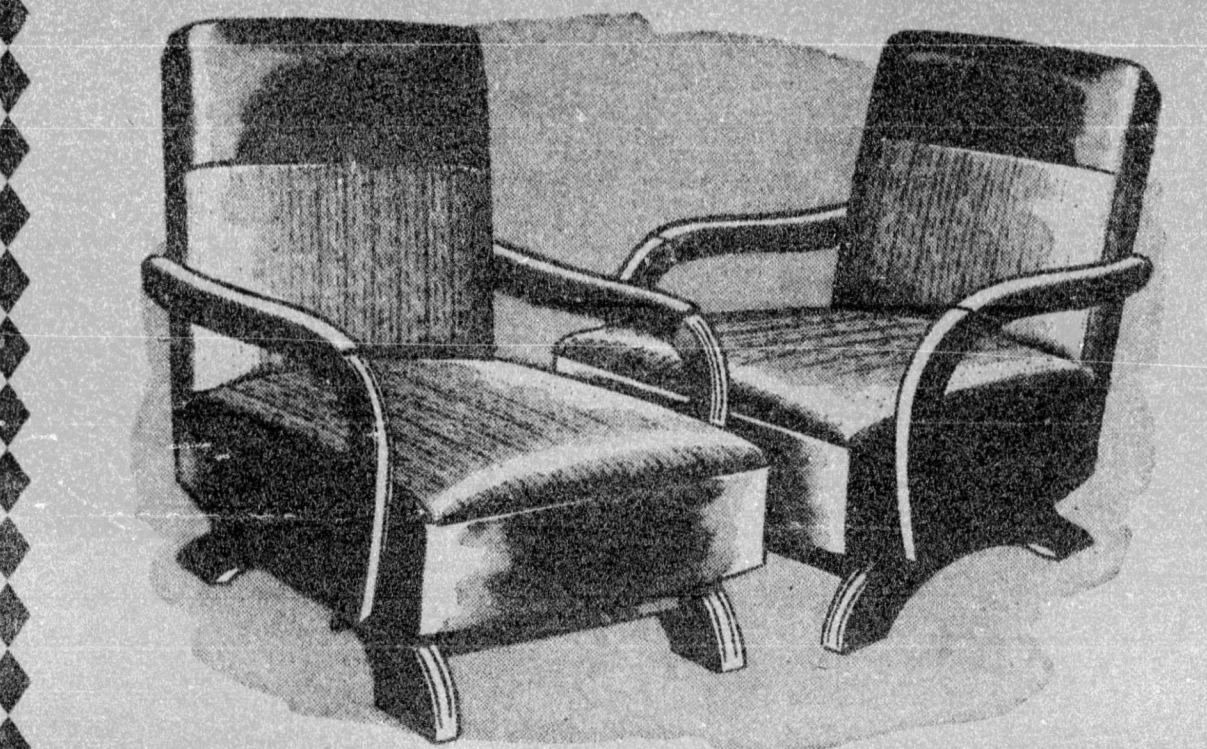
