L. E. AUSTIN SPEAKS
L. E. Austin, editor of the Carolina Times, Durham, spoke at the Bloodworth Street YMCA on Monday at the regular weekly meeting of the Ministerial Alliance. He was presided by the Rev. C. W. Trumblefield with the president of the Alliance, Rev. P. H. Johnson, presiding.

Discussing the subject "The Power Of Sacrificial Leadership," Mr. Austin stated that one key to the solution of today's problems is to find leaders who will devote their own personal desires and ambitions in order that the welfare of the total community may be increased or improved.

There is also the attitude on the part of many people to over rate white collar professions and tend to discredit business and skilled jobs. This results in a weak economic base which undermines our economic base.

In reply to his own question "What Is That In Time Hand?" the speaker stated that Negro citizens today have a feeling of togetherness as was demonstrated in Montgomery and the ballot guaranteed by the course which may be used to help solve today's problems.

VALENTINE SALAD
(Makes 8 to 10 servings)
2 cups (#303 can) fruit cocktail
2 packages strawberry-flavored gelatin
Syrup plus water to make 3 cups
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 cup undiluted CARNATION EVAPORATED MILK
1/4 cup lemon juice
1/4 cup chopped celery
Drain fruit. Dissolve gelatin in boiling syrup-water mixture. Pour 1 cup of hot gelatin into a 2-quart mold. Refrigerate until set. Chill remaining gelatin until consistency of unbeaten egg white. Add mayonnaise, Carnation and lemon juice. Mix well. Stir in fruit and celery. Pour into mold or top of clear gelatin layer. Chill until firm, about 2 hours.
