**GREENSBORO**—Duplin County was named the winner of the "County of the Year" Award for rural progress in the State during 1937. The announcement was made by Dr. G. E. Rankin, chairman of the State Rural Progress Campaign with special reference to Negroes and acting dean of the School of Agriculture at A. and T. College, sponsor of the movement.

The award, \$500 in cash, is given annually to the county in which the Negro rural population has contributed the most impressive gains to the overall development of the county.

The cash prize is being given by Thomas A. Morgan, New York City, a former native and farm operator in Vance County and who recently retired as chairman of the executive board of the Sperry Gyroscope Company in New York.

Duplin County won out over five other finalist counties, including: Anson, Richmond, Robeson, Harnett and Rockingham. A total of 71 counties competed in the original eliminations. The evaluation committee, headed by Dr. Rankin, visited each of the six finalist counties last week and arrived at the decision on the basis
