

Dr. Rose Butler Browne Local AKA's Founder's Day Orator

Alpha Theta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and the thirtieth anniversary of the founding of the chapter at the First Baptist Church on Wednesday, Feb. 3, at 11:00 a.m. The speaker for the service will be Dr. Rose Butler Browne, former Regional Director of the South Atlantic Region of the sorority.

Dr. Browne is the wife of the Rev. Emmet T. Browne, Sr., of Durham and chairman of the Department of Education of the North Carolina College at Durham. Dr. Browne received her A.B. degree at the University of Rhode Island, the A.M. degree at Rhode Island College of Education and her Ed.D. at Harvard University. She also holds an Honorary Ed.D. from Rhode Island College of Education.

Former positions held by Dr. Browne are instructor at Virginia State College; Chairman of the Department of Psychology, Virginia State College; Head of Psychology Department, West Virginia State College; Head of Department of Education, Bluefield State Teachers College; and Professor of Education at North Carolina State College at Durham.

Maceo A. Davis: Ligon Grad To Haiti As A Jehovah's Representative

Maceo A. Davis, formerly of Raleigh, is being assigned to Haiti where he will serve as a special missionary representative for Jehovah's Witnesses. He will graduate from the Watchtower Bible School of Gilead, South Lansing, New York on February 9.

Mr. Davis graduated from the J. W. Ligon High School in June, 1954 and engaged in ministerial work here in Raleigh for a few months thereafter. He was sent from here in 1954 to Kingston where he was instrumental in organizing congregations.

Prior to entering the missionary school in September last year, he was serving as presiding minister of one of the Dillon, S. C., congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses.

Speaking of the graduation, Mr. Davis said: Speaking good news earth-wide might be the theme of

our unusual missionary school." He explained: "Everywhere people are in fear, not knowing the Bible's simple solution to the problems the world faces. How-

ever, in this world of crime and delinquency there is sure confidence in a change—a change that is promised in God's Word, but that is coming in His way, not man's."

During the past 15 years Gilead School, sponsored by the Watchtower Society, the directing agency for Jehovah's Witnesses, has received over 3,000 students from 58 countries. It has given them an intensified course of Christian missionary training and has sent them out as ministers to more than 100 lands.

Students of the present 30th class, which Mr. Davis will graduate, will be assigned to 24 countries, including Paraguay, Peru, Argentina, Haiti, North Borneo, East Africa, Honduras, Morocco, Nisaland, Bolivia, Venezuela, France, Northern Rhodesia, British Isles, Columbia, Norway, Korea, Israel, Eke, Singapore, Guatemala, Ecuador, United States and Canada.

Two thousand relatives and friends of the graduates are expected to attend the weekend program in South Lansing, New York this week.

Farm Population Down Nearly 5th Since '50 Census

The farm population dropped from 25.1 million to 20.4—or close to a fifth—between 1950 and 1957, says the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

The decline is attributed to lower needs for manpower on farms, increased job opportunities in non-agricultural industries, and higher pay offered for non-farm work.

Other factors said to account for the farm population decline are: the search for better educational opportunities, change of residence by retired farmers, and failure of many military inductees to return to the farm.

Between 1930 and 1950, the nonwhite farm population decreased from 4,231,268 to 3,336,590, or a drop of more than 2 million and a half. Figures for 1957 are not available. But if the decline among non-whites is at the same rate as the total farm population, the non-estimated 600,000 have left since 1950.
