## National Teacher Exams Completed At Fayetteville

**FAYETTEVILLE**—Fifty-seven teachers and prospective teachers in this area took the National Teacher Examinations at Fayetteville State Teachers College on February 15, 1958, according to Edward W. Hargrave, School Psychologist, who supervised the administration of the tests.

The National Teacher Examinations are given annually by the Educational Testing Service, 20 Nassau Street, Princeton, New Jersey.

Scores on the National Teacher Examinations are used by a large number of school systems and teacher education institutions throughout the country as an aid in evaluating such of the qualifications of prospective teachers as are measured by the tests, Hargrave said.

The scores may also be useful to examinees who are interested in discovering their own strengths and weaknesses with respect to such teacher qualifications as are measured by the tests, he added.

At the one-day testing session a candidate may take the Common Examinations which include tests in Professional Information, General Culture, English Expression, and Non-Verbal Reasoning. In addition, each candidate may take one or two Optional Examinations which are designed to demonstrate mastery of subject matter in the fields in which the candidate is prepared.
