(A) No. Numerous tests have been conducted on removing suckers at different times and in different ways. The results show that no significant benefits have resulted in earliness, size of ear or in total yield. The reason for this is that raw materials, brought into the plant from the soil, are not utilized in the development of the ear, or in other growth, until they have undergone manufacture in the plant. The suckers aid in this manufacture. During the growing season, we are literally surrounded by manufacturing plants, but most people are not interested.

## Oil From Nigeria Termed 'World's Most Expensive'

LAGOS, Nigeria — (ANP) — The first shipment of crude oil to be exported from Nigeria, which was pumped into the Shell tanker "Hemifusus" this week, has been described as the world's most expensive cargo. It is the result of 21 years of search for oil in Nigeria at a cost of 27,000,000 pounds, to which will be added a further 10,000,000 pounds this year. But according to the Shell-B. P. Petroleum Development Com-

pany of Nigeria which is responsible for the venture, evidence of sufficient oil to ensure that the venture will be a profitable one for Nigeria and the Company has not yet been found. The oil, which is on its way to Shell's Refining refinery in Rotterdam, in the Netherlands, was obtained from two oilfields which are being put on test production for several months by the company to determine their economic potentialities.

## Enlarged Library Features Livingstone Founders Day

SALISBURY — A recent highlight on the campus of Livingstone College was the formal opening of the remodeled and enlarged Carnegie Library. The library facilities have been greatly expanded, the project only recently completed at a cost of approximately \$62,000. Funds for the major project came from the contributions of the United Negro College Fund and the Founder's Day Fund. The library itself was built in 1907. Two additions have since been added. The first was in 1947 and the second was completed shortly before 1958. The last represents the

largest of the two expansion programs. The original library was located in Huntington Hall which burned in 1918. Huntington Hall was one of the buildings erected after the colleges moved to Salisbury from Concord in 1882. The college, known then as Zion Wesley Institute, was first established in Concord in 1879. The College became Livingstone College in 1884. The three-man group of distinguished Negro educators comprised a committee that went to Pittsburgh to see Andrew Carnegie early during the century to ask for donations for construction of a library building.

This is a calm sunny day in Raleigh with a pleasant temperature of about 45 degrees. Quite a contrast with the below freezing temperatures we have had for many days. Gives you the urge to begin working the soil if it ever dries out enough. Maybe this is a good time to answer a backlog of questions which have accumulated. (Q) Will cucumbers cross with other vine crops such as, watermelons, cantaloupes, pumpkins or squashes? (A) No. Varieties of cucumbers cross readily but not with

the other vine crops mentioned. (Q) Will yellow corn cross with white? (A) Yes. This is more or less common knowledge but the question is still asked. Pollen of the white corn will cause some of the kernels of the yellow variety to be white, giving a spotted appearance; yellow corn will cause white corn to be spotted with yellow kernels. Sweet corn should not be planted near field or pop corn. This points out the importance of not planting yellow varieties like Tornado and Golden Bantam with such
