## A&T College Sponsoring 2nd Mexican Study Tour

GREENBORO—An eighteen-day study tour to enchanting Mexico, which includes credit towards a master's degree is being planned for this summer by A&T College. The tour dates include June 24-July 10.

Dr. F. A. Williams, dean of the A&T Graduate School, said that the course, "Comparative Education," to be offered on the tour, carries credits up to six-quarter hours.

Most of the study will be conducted in Mexico City and Acapulco, but other visits are scheduled for such towns and villages as: Miguel Allende, Paracuaro, Morelia, and San Jose Purua.

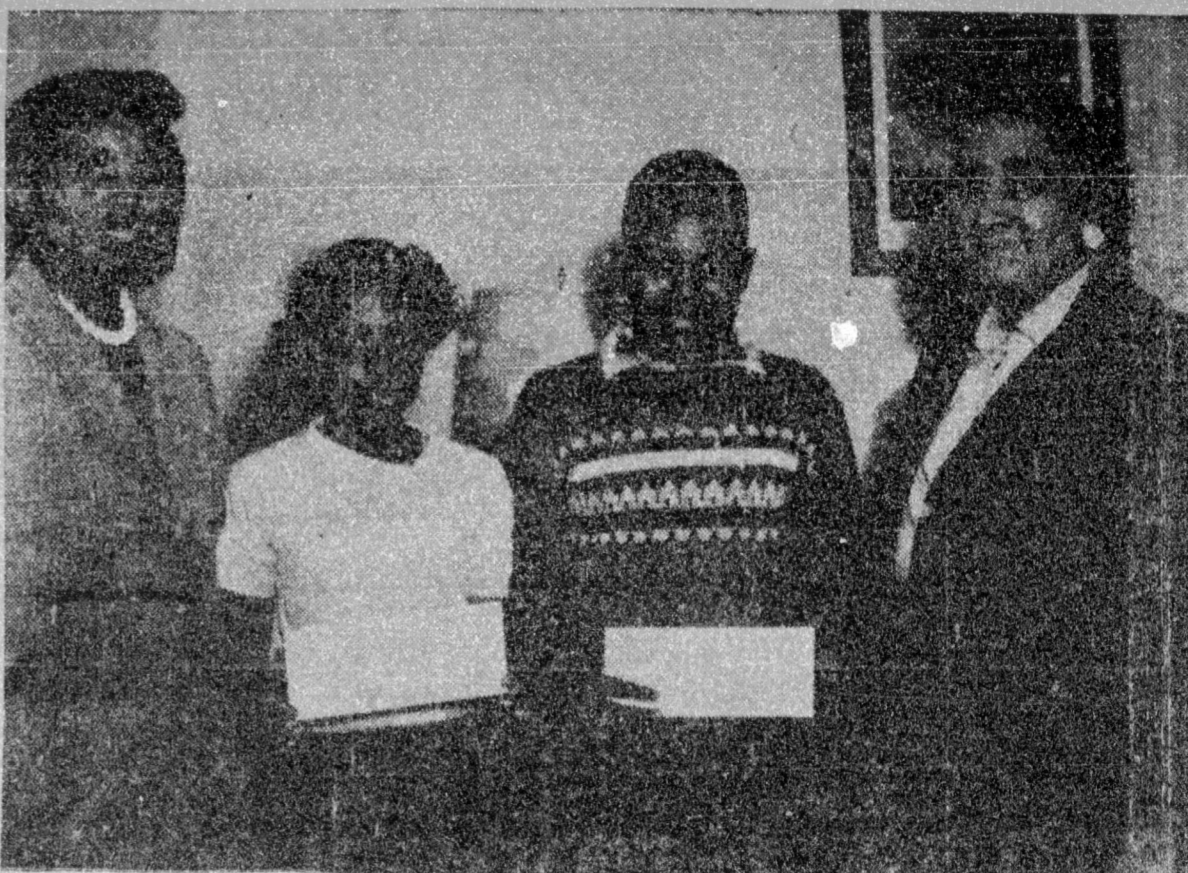
He told reporters that while accommodations have been arranged on first class standards, costs for the tour have been held to a minimum.

It is the second annual study to be sponsored by the college. A group of 30 persons participated in a similar tour through the Caribbean last summer.

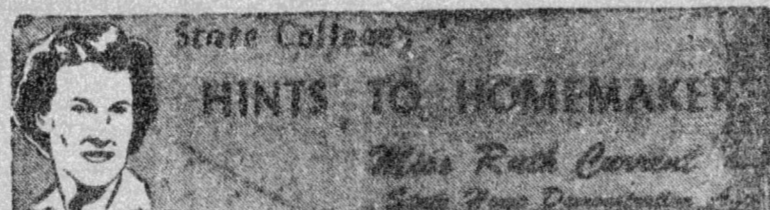
All travel, except short motor visits to other communities will be by air, also first class over Eastern Airlines. The instruction will be conducted by members of the faculty of the A&T Graduate School.

**DIFFERENT PIE TO-DO'S** — Next time you make a pastry mix, fruit pie or use a pastry mix, substitute chilled apple juice for the water. Gives an extra bit of flavor that complements the fruit flavor of the filling.

**Pope Pius Wins Carver Award**

ROME, Italy (AP) — Pope Pius XII received a rare honor last week. The Roman Catholic Pontiff received the George Washington Carver Memorial gold medal award for outstanding contribution to the betterment of race relations and human welfare.

The award consists of a large gold medal on the face of which is the likeness of the renowned Negro scientist. A plaque on mounting of the medal bears the inscription: to "His Holiness Pope Pius XII for outstanding contribution to the betterment of race relations and human welfare."

**Dr. Copher Pleases At Shaw Univ.**

In Dr. Charles E. Copher's message at Shaw University on Monday, March 3, he asked the question: "Can we be Christians today or is the question 'Will I be a Christian today?'"

Speaking on the subject "Discipleship and Its Costs," he stated that Christian discipleship involves three shipsh: (1) Learnership, (2) Fellowship, and (3) Sonship to God. The disciple is a learner of Christ by precept and example.

Thinking of discipleship in terms of words rather than deeds does one no good. Discipleship involves self denial when it comes to unworthy, immediate goals, for the ultimate goal of a long and happy life. "Sonship," he declared, "is the epitome of Christian discipleship. The ability to love your enemies and to pray for those who persecute you involves the desire to be a son of God." The audience enjoyed the address.

The Tuesday morning sermon was delivered by the Reverend Gaylord Noyce, minister of the United Church here. His subject will be "Be Yourself."

## State College Answers

**QUESTION:** At what rate should I sow my burley tobacco bed?

**ANSWER:** Experiments and demonstrations show that one-sixth ounce or one level teaspoonful of seed is enough to sow a bed 8 by 100 feet or 100 square feet or 100 square yards, provided good plant management is carried out. Most burley growers buy one-half or an ounce of seed. If a plant could be grown from each seed in an ounce, there would be enough plants to set 40 acres of tobacco.

**QUESTION:** What's this "cattle referendum" that I've been hearing about?

**ANSWER:** It's a self-assessment program which—if it passes when voted upon March 15—will be used to support a promotion program to encourage the production and consumption of beef in North Carolina. Under the set-up, buyers of cattle for slaughter would collect 10 cents per head on all slaughter cattle which sell for as much as \$29 per head. Two-thirds of those voting must approve the plan if it is to go into effect.

**QUESTION:** Must acres remain "idle" under the Soil Bank acreage reserve plan?

**ANSWER:** No. Farmers may establish a vegetable cover on the land, and thereby eliminate the erosion hazard and at the same time help to control the growth of noxious weeds on the land. As a matter of fact, under the ASC's Agricultural Conservation Program, assistance is offered for carrying out such conservation practices. However, the cover crop can't be harvested or grazed if planted on reserve acres.

The presentation was made by James Zellerbach, U. S. ambassador to Italy.

Both President Eisenhower and Cardinal Spellman, Catholic archbishop of New York, are past recipients of the award.
