To Address The
UNCF Meet Soon**

NEW YORK — Dr. Carroll V. Newsom, president of New York University, will speak on the "Challenge to America" at the 1958 United Negro College Fund Convocation to be held in Minneapolis (Minn.), the week end of March 14.

The public meeting, to be addressed by Dr. Newsom, will take place Sunday, March 16, at 8:15 p. m. in the Northrop Memorial Auditorium on the University of Minnesota campus. Sharing the platform with Dr. Newsom will be Arthur D. Gray, president, Talladega (Talladega, Ala.), one of the 33 member colleges of the College Fund. He will explain the work and function of the fund-raising organization.

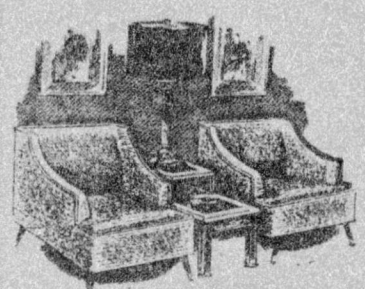
The four-day convocation will be attended by the 33 presidents of the member colleges and other members of the College Fund's board of directors. The program includes receptions, luncheons, dinners, special church services, tours, and meetings.

Thomas Moore, president of the Coca Cola Bottling Company of Minneapolis and president of the Hotel Radisson, is serving as convocation chairman. Judson Bemis, executive vice president, Bemis Bros. Bag Company, is co-chairman.

Dr. Newsom, one of the country's leading educators, is a distinguished mathematician. Author of four mathematics texts and wartime manuals for the armed services, he also is a regular contributor to mathematics and education journals.

He began his career at the University of Michigan and taught at the University of New Mexico and Oberlin (Ohio). Dr. Newsom holds 12 honorary degrees awarded in recognition of his contribution to the field of higher education.

**Ghana Planning
Many Events For
First Birthday**

ACCRA, Ghana (ANP) — The provisional programme for the first anniversary of Ghana independence have been announced by the Minister for Justice Mr. A. A. Adjei, who is Chairman of the celebration committee.

The celebrations are due to open with religious services on the Sunday preceding the anniversary. There will be a mass picnic, the unveiling of the Prime Minister's statue now being erected on the lawn in front of Parliament House, a broadcast by Dr. Kwame Nkrumah and a torch light procession by voluntary and national organizations.

On the actual day March 6th, there will be a combined march past and displays by the Army, Police, Naval Volunteers Force and schools at the Sport Stadium. The Prime Minister will take the salute.

Other activities for the day will be the opening of the Ghana New Agency headquarters in Ghana House, a regatta at Accra Harbour, a reception by the Governor-General at the State House.

Women's Day, Friday, March 7, will culminate in the election of "Miss Ghana" 1958. The opening of Broadcasting House, and other cultural activities.

Activities for the following day include a function at the University College, Legon, an official reception by the Prime Minister at Government House, Oct. and anniversary dance.

There will also be a special showing at the Rex Cinema of the Ghana Film Unit production "Ghana".

BRITISH HISTORIAN AT NCC MAR. 3-4

DURHAM — Dr. Marjorie Reeves, historian from Oxford University, England, spoke at North Carolina College on Monday and Tuesday (March 3, 4).

She gave a public lecture at the 10:30 forum on Tuesday in Duke Auditorium. She appeared under the sponsorship of the Durham Foundation and the Arts Program of the Association of American Colleges.

Dr. Reeves, a native of Wiltshire, England, is at present vice-principal and Fellow of St. Anne's College (Oxford). Lecturer in the University of Oxford, and Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.

She is co-author of a book on education "Growing Up in a Modern Society" and author of the Hazen Foundation publication, "Three Questions in Higher Education".

In the "Then and There Series" of history books for children, edited by Dr. Reeves, she has written the volumes on "The Medieval Village", "The Medieval Town", "The Court of Queen Elizabeth I", and — to appear shortly — "The Medieval Monastery".

She has also contributed articles on "The Christian College in the Western Educational World", "The Christian in Education" and "The vocation of the Christian Teacher" to "The Christian Scholar".
